Parkston Woman Dies In Sunday Accident

PARKSTON — A Parkston woman died in a one-vehicle crash 16 miles east of Parkston on Sunday, Dec. 1. Sherry Kay Baker, 33, was driving a 1991 Oldsmobile Cutlass westbound on S.D. Highway 44 and struck livestock that was on the highway. During the collision, a bull struck the hood and windshield of Baker's vehi-

cle. Because of the impact, Baker sustained fatal injuries; she was not wearing a seat-belt.

No further information is immediately available.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating. Hutchinson County Sheriff's Office and Freeman Fire and Ambulance assisted.

cents \$13.2125 a bushel. Beef mixed and pork fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle rose .02 cent to \$1.3427 a pound; January feeder cattle fell .12 cent to \$1.6535 a pound; while February lean hogs were .12 cent lower at \$9.045 a pound.
