County Property Sold At Auction Monday

A small strip of property at the former Yankton County Highway Shop site was sold at auction Monday.

Joe Schieffer was the sole bidder during the auction, which was managed by East River Auctioneers. The winning bid was \$2,000, according to Yankton

County Commission Chairman Bruce Jensen. In Åugust, Schieffer put in a bid of \$21,000 for the 50-

foot by 94-foot strip on the south side of West 11th Street that has Broadway Avenue frontage and adjoins his auto business.

"We couldn't take it because it wasn't 90 percent of the appraised value, which was \$47,000," Jensen said.

After waiting for the amount of time stipulated by state law, Jensen said the county was able to sell the property Monday for a more realistic price.

In August, Schieffer was also the winning bidder on the neighboring Highway Shop property, which included 4,600 square feet of land with several buildings. He paid \$142,000 for it.

Communications Technology Available To South Dakotans With Vision, Hearing Loss

PIERRE — Many thousands of Americans who have combined loss of hearing and vision may soon connect with family, friends and community thanks to the National Deaf-Blind Equipment Distribution Program.

This new federal program provides support for the local distribution of a wide array of accessible communications technology. It was mandated by the 21st Century Communications and Video Accessibility Act (CVAA) and established by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

The FCC is also funding a national outreach campaign to educate the public about this new program. The iCanConnect campaign will be con-School for the Blind in Watertown, Mass., and Helen Keller National Center in New York City, N.Y.

to contribute to their communities," said DHS Secretary Gloria Pearson. "This important technology-access program furthers those goals, so we want to use iCanConnect to help spread the word throughout South Dakota."

Through iCanConnect.org/southdakota/, individuals, their family members or care givers will find information about the program including who qualifies, what equipment is available, how it is being distributed and installed, and how to receive training. This information is also available to people who call toll free at (800) 825-4595.

The National Deaf-Blind **Equipment Distribution Pro**gram was created so people who are blind and can remain safe and healthy, hold a job, manage a household and contribute to the economy and the community. Additional information is available through the FCC at fcc.gov/NDBEDP/. The CVAA acknowledges that advances in technology can revolutionize lives. Nearly 1 million people in the United States have some combination of vision and hearing loss. People with combined loss of vision and hearing as defined by the Helen Keller National Center Act whose income does not exceed 400 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are eligible to participate in the new program.
