Many proponents believe e-cigarettes are safer than tobacco-based cigarettes and can actually aid in quitting traditional cigarettes.

A report released by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) in September shows that e-cigarette use has greatly increased during the last few years, especially among youth. In 2011, 4.7 percent of middle and high school students reported trying e-cigarettes. That number increased to 10 percent in 2012.

Hunhoff said he believes the Legislature will look into the concerns surrounding their use, especially among youth.

"There are three issues the Legislature will probably eventually look at: Whether minors should be prohibited from buying and smoking them, whether or how they should be taxed and whether they fall under the smoking ban," he said.

Hunhoff said he was unsure of whether or not the issue would be raised during the 2014 legislative session, saying many lawmakers are waiting for more information about potential health risks.

"We're all kind of waiting on the FDA to come out with some conclusions on how harmful they are, if there's any damage, negative

there was no reason to believe the public was in any danger at that point.

The FBI is following leads in the case and coordinating efforts with other law enforcement agencies, Loven said. The FBI isn't releasing details in compliance with U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) regulations, he said.

Loven acknowledged that state and local authorities are perceived as more forthcoming than federal officials in releasing details about a case. However, federal agencies operate under much tighter regulations.

"On the federal side, any time we have an active investigation, we are simply prohibited from speaking about the investigation, and that's just the DOJ rule," he said. "The FBI is under the DOJ, so we abide by that."

At that point, the FBI operates under "a code of silence," he added.

The name of the Wagner shooting victim had come out through various sources but was only recently confirmed through the U.S. attorney's office, Loven said.

While not commenting specifically on the Wagner shooting, Loven noted that investigations can take an extensive amount of time. He pointed to one FBI case that lasted a year before its resolution.

"There was a horrific event in North Dakota last year. It was just around Thanksgiving time in New Town, where an individual had gone into a home and killed the grandmother and (three) grandchildren," he said.

"The people of New Town wanted to know what happened and what occurred on the (Fort Berthold) reservation. ... The shooter in the case committed suicide. The question for me (as a spokesman): 'Basically the shooter committed suicide. We want to know why the FBI isn't releasing information.'"

South Dakota said signups have grown substantially since Nov. 30, partly because of fixes to HealthCare.gov, the website where people can buy new insurance plans. Avera Health Plans now reports enrolling 734 so far through the exchange and Sanford Health Plan has enrolled 182. DAKOTACARE, associated with the South Dakota State Medical Association, has enrolled 14.

The federal report also said the marketplace has determined that 540 people in South Dakota are eligible for Medicaid, the state-federal program that pays health care costs for people too

impacts on others, if they lead to nicotine addiction or if they're helpful and help people (quit smoking)," he said. "There's a lot of questions to be answered and I think the FDA will have to come up with more conclusive information before state policymakers can really settle this."

Currently, New Jersey, New Hampshire, Arizona, Maryland, Minnesota and New York have enacted or are seeking to enact varying degrees of regulation concerning e-cigarettes — mostly prohibiting sales to minors.

Potential health effects of e-cigarettes are still unclear. Dr. Michael P. Pietila, MD, FCCP, of the Yankton Medical Clinic said there is still a long way to go in terms of concrete answers.

"The understanding we have about them is only short term because they've only been around for a few years," Pietila said. "Long-term consequences? We have no idea."

Pietila said one study has found some adverse short-term effects.

"There was a study that was published in the journal (CHEST Journal) of the American College of Chest Physicians in June of 2012," he said. "They published that smoking e-cigarettes does have an immediate, short-term effect on the lungs as demonstrated by measuring certain chemicals and responses in the airways. So there is some negative

poor to buy their own insurance.

Kim Jones, coordinator of the South Dakota Navigator Coalition, said the revamped website is much improved and now gives people a better chance to compare prices and services of different plans. But the website still does not work as smoothly as it should to sign up people from start to finish, she said.

"I'm sure there will be more improvements each day. But at this point, we still find ourselves struggling to get people enrolled in a smooth continuum," Jones said.

People seeking insurance can shop through the website, by phone, by submitting a paper application or by meeting with navigators or counselors at all community

impact on the lungs in the short term."

Additionally, Pietila said there will need to be several years of additional research before a conclusion can be reached.

However, e-cigarettes may still not be as bad as traditional cigarettes.

"Despite the fact that we don't have proof that (e-cigarettes are) harmful to you, it's probably less harmful than traditional cigarettes are," he said. "It's important to note that we don't know that for sure."

When asked by patients if the e-cigarette is effective in helping them quit, Pietila said he usually recommends they give up all forms of smoking.

"Smoking e-cigarettes doesn't necessarily mean that you won't smoke regular cigarettes, so a lot of smokers who turn to e-cigarettes continue to smoke regular cigarettes and still expose themselves to the adverse health consequences of that," he said. "Patients come to me all the time who are smoking and ask, 'Do you recommend I try the e-cigarettes?' and I generally tell them no. I encourage them to stop without smoking — that includes vaping."
