# Longtime Menno Judge Passes Away

### From P&D and AP Reports

MENNO - Longtime local judge Ernest Hertz, who was the presiding judge in the first Donald Moeller murder trial, died Sunday at his home in Menno. He was 91.

Hertz received his law degree from the University of South Dakota in 1948. He practiced law and served as state's attorney until 1970 when he was appointed to the first judicial circuit, where he served for 22 years. Hertz was presiding judge of the circuit from 1975 until his retirement in 1993.

The first Moeller trial occurred in Yankton in 1992 Moeller was convicted of raping and killing 9-year-old Becky O'Connell in Sioux Falls. The jury returned the state's first death penalty decree in decades. The conviction was eventually thrown out, but Moeller was convicted again in 1997 and sentenced to die. He was executed in 2012.

Funeral services will be Friday in Menno. The Aisenbrey-Opsahl-Kostel Funeral Chapel in Menno is in charge of arrangements.




