The Yankton Sertoma Club's recent \$8,546.00 matching donation to Yankton school district fulfills their pledge to insure every Yankton Public School Elementary Classroom has a soundfield amplification system. The Better Community Гhrough Better He aring prop ect was developed to raise funds to purchase soundfield systems for every Yankton Elementary School classroom. The project began slowly five years ago with the purchase of only one system per year. Commitments from the Yankton Sertoma club and significant support from Sertoma International, Yankton School District, Avera Medical Group Audiology, Avera Foundation, Otto Ulrich Foundation, Yankton Area Foundation and area Parent Teacher Associations raised nearly \$65,000 to reach the goal of purchasing and installing 65 Lightspeed RedCat soundfield systems.
