The Dow Jones industrial average fell 78.57 points, or 0.4 percent, to 17,719.92.  
The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 9.70 points, or 0.5 percent, to 2,080.41.  
The Nasdaq composite index lost 18.86 points, or 0.4 percent, to 5,108.67.

The Dow is down 103.15 points, or 0.6 percent.  
The S&P is up 21.51 points, or 1 percent.  
The Nasdaq is up 372.61 points, or 7.9 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for March delivery fell 3.50 cents to \$4.7550 a bushel; March corn rose 5 cents to 3.7225 a bushel; March oats were off .25 cent to 2.3250 a bushel; while January soybeans advanced 8 cents to \$8.81 bushel.  
Beef and pork were lower on

the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was off 1.50 cents to \$1.3235 a pound; January feeder cattle was declined 3.27 cents to \$1.6275 a pound; while February lean hogs fell .87 cent at \$5.680 a pound.

The first shipments are scheduled to arrive in January, the press release said.
