Kindle sent the following message to Yankton School District parents.

"I want to inform you occurred this afternoon at Yankton High School. Two unidentified individuals entered YHS without permission. Both were approached by staff and later taken into custody by law enforcement," he said.

"An investigation is ongoing regarding this incident. As a precaution, an officer will be present throughout the day at each school building on Friday."

Kindle urged school patrons to rely on the district

and other authorities for official, accurate information regarding Thursday's incident and further developments.

"Please do not use social media as a source of information or rumors," he told parents. "Additional information will be provided from law enforcement and the Yankton School District on Friday."

Kindle concluded Thursday's alert to the YSD parents with a reassuring message.

Thank you for entrusting us with your child," he said. "We are proud to have you as part of the Yankton Šchool District.'


