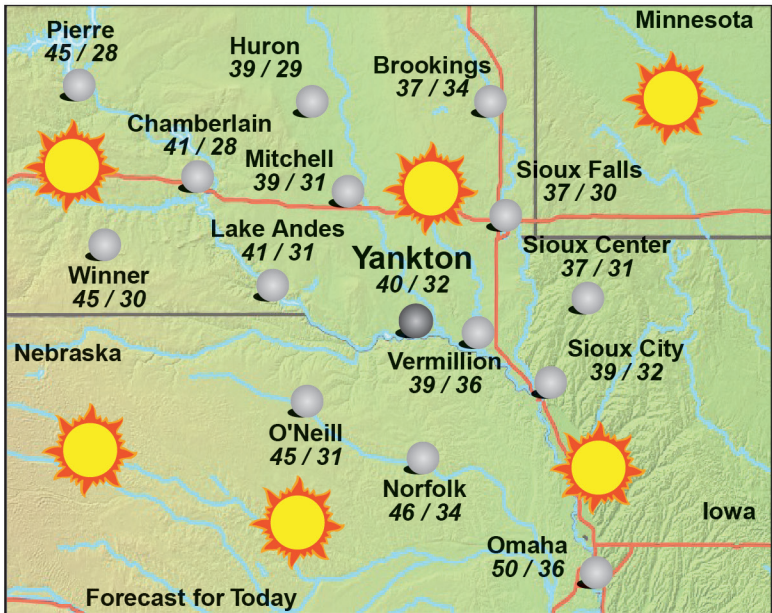

immediately available on the incident.

Kindle sent the following message to Yankton School District parents.

"I want to inform you about an incident which occurred this afternoon at Yankton High School. Two unidentified individuals entered YHS without permission. Both were approached by staff and later taken into custody by law enforcement," he said.

"An investigation is ongoing regarding this incident. As a precaution, an officer will be present throughout the day at each school building on Friday."

Kindle urged school patrons to rely on the district

and other authorities for official, accurate information regarding Thursday's incident and further developments.

"Please do not use social media as a source of information or rumors," he told parents. "Additional information will be provided from law enforcement and the Yankton School District on Friday."

Kindle concluded Thursday's alert to the YSD parents with a reassuring message.

"Thank you for entrusting us with your child," he said. "We are proud to have you as part of the Yankton School District."

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery advanced 11.50 cents to \$4.7875 a bushel; March corn was up 6.75 cents to 3.77 a bushel; March oats rose 4.50 cents to 2.3975 a bushel; while January soybeans gained

5.25 cents to \$8.9750 bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was off 2.17 cents to \$1.2945 a pound; January feeder cattle fell .97 cent to \$1.5975 a pound; while February lean hogs lost .33 cent at \$5.882 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

Global markets sank Thursday after the European Central Bank announced stimulus plans that came up short of what investors had forecast. The bond market was especially roiled by the ECB's move. Bond prices in the U.S. and Europe fell sharply, and yields jumped.

FOR THURSDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 252.01 points, or 1.4 percent, to 17,477.67. The Standard & Poor's 500 index dropped 29.89 points, or 1.4 percent, to 2,049.62. The Nasdaq composite index

fell 85.70 points, or 1.7 percent, to 5,037.53.

FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow is down 320.82 points, or 1.8 percent. The S&P 500 is down 40.49 points, or 1.9 percent. The Nasdaq composite is down 90 points, or 1.8 percent.

The Dow is down 345.40 points, or 1.9 percent. The S&P is down 9.28 points, or 0.5 percent. The Nasdaq is up 301.47 points, or 6.4 percent.
