Defending state champion Mitchell proved why they are the team to beat again this year as they took home first place in Yankton's gymnastics triangular on Thursday night. Parkston-Ethan-Hanson, a program

that is only in its second year, was third. Mitchell finished at 142.0, with Yankton posting a 135.2. Parkston-Ethan-Hanson finished at 95.2 on the day.

Mitchell took the top three all-around scores as Quinci Herll topped the boards with a score of 35.75. Emily Prill scored a 35.6 and Josie Dierks scored a 34.95. Yankton's Haleigh Diede and Jaiden Boomsma came in fourth and fifth respectively with scores of 34.65 and 35.05.

"We were hanging with them (Mitchell) for a lot of it, we knew that they are the team team to beat," said Yankton Head Coach Luke Youmans.

Parkston-Ethan-Hanson finished in third place with an overall score of 95.2 despite only having four girls available and one of them, Jada Plastow, fighting a knee injury that limits her to only the bars. Freshman McKenzie Prunty finished with an overall of 34.05 and Tyra Zens with a 33.65. Prunty had the highest placement for PEH with her second place performance on the bars.

"It was more of a quote-unquote practice just to let the girls get the jitters out and see where their scores are now compared to last year," said Parkston-Ethan-

SIOUX FALLS — The championship entrants from the state's highest football class were well-represented with the unveiling of the all-state team, as voted on by the South Dakota Football Coaches Association.

Champion Washington and runner-up O'Gorman paced the Class 11AAA allstate team with six first-team selections each, while Roosevelt placed five players and Lincoln four.

Washington's reascension to the top of the '11AAA' ranks started with brothers Matt and Will Farniok leading an offensive line that opened big holes all season. Running back Chayden Fitzsimmons and tight end Ty Smith were also rewarded for their efforts, while disruptive end Joey Wehrkamp and safety Logan Eckhoff stood tall for a defense that allowed just 10 points a game.

"They fight for each other and they know they need each other," said coach Chad Stadem. "We platoon, and both our units take on that mentality. Even in practice they cheer each other on." O'Gorman's Luke Fritsch earned first-team honors at arguably the most crowded position in '11AAA' - quarterback. The dual-threat senior piled up nearly 2,000 yards of offense for the Knights, rushing 153 times for 882 yards and 17 scores to go with 1,088 passing yards and 12 touchdowns through the air. The Knights' other selections demonstrate their versatility: Dodi Makwinja (fullback), Billy Daniel (linebacker), Antonio Casiello (cornerback) and Boston Bauer (special teams) all played valuable two-way roles this season. O'Gorman also placed kicker Kristian Jakowicz. "Going into this year, this group of seniors had some special skill-sets that we haven't had in a while," said O'Gorman coach Steve Kueter. "There were some things we could do with these kids with their skills and their speed." Sioux Falls' Class 11AAA dominance continued in 2015 with 24 of 28 first-team players coming from metro area schools. Running back Grant Youngblood and linebacker Brett Beyer (RC Stevens), wide receiver Layne Tieszen (Aberdeen Central) and cornerback Nate Davis (Watertown) earned firstteam honors.
