Errand For Mercy

Christian Group To Perform Concert To Benefit Mercy Meals Yankton

ercy Meals Yankton is about to get a Yuletidefueled boost. On Saturday, Dec. 5, contemporary Christian band Phillips, Craig and Dean will perform at the Yankton High School Theater at 7 p.m. Musician Shaun Groves will also give a perfor-

The band has an unorthodox membership in that all three members are pastors of their own churches. They also live in different loca-

tions, two in Texas and one in Missouri. According to band founder and singer Randy Phillips, all three of them have known each other since childhood, but hadn't performed

together before the band was started. I wanted to form a music group to see what would happen," he explained. "I called my two friends (Shawn Craig and Dan Dean) and we put a few songs on a demo and sent it to Nashville.

From there, the band's career snowballed. "People began to buy our music and play it all over the country," said Phillips. "It took everyone by surprise.

The band's unorthodox membership makes their 25-year career all the more surprising in how steadfast they have remained in the Christian music business.

'We've had 25 number one songs in 25 years. The Lord has been good to us," Phillips

The band is on tour to promote its new Christmas album, "Hope For All The World."

"When you look at the circumstances around us right now, there's a terrible fear in our country with shootings and violence. instability of economy and an election year," said Phillips. "People are so unsettled."

The band's newest album, which consists

of traditional and original Christmas music, is filled with music that is much needed in today's world.

There's still hope for the world," Phil-

lips said. "That hope isn't found in politics, government or anything man can put his hand on. Our hope is in Jesus Christ."

This message is what Phillips, Craig and Dean will bring to Yankton.

"We intend to come to Yankton and lift up the beautiful name of Jesus," said Phillips. "We can journey to the manger together."

All the concert's proceeds go towards Mercy Meals, a non-profit organization that started in Yankton four years ago. The organization, originally called Kids Against Hunger, does most of their meal packing at Calvary

Baptist Church in Yankton, according to director Steve Mach.

"We organize volunteers to pack nutritious meals that are sent to Haiti to help feed the children there," he explained.

Mercy Meals sends its packed meals to the Orphan Ğrain Train organization in Norfolk, Nebraska, to have them sent to Haiti where the Orphan Grain Train sponsors six schools.

Mercy Meals receives a majority of its funds through donations from people who vol-unteer to help pack food. Mach estimates that each meal costs approximately 12 cents. The meals packed consist of rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a vitamin E mineral packet.

The concert proceeds will mainly go toward an annual meal packing held in January at Mike Durfee state prison in Springfield. Over 60,000 were packed there last January.

In previous years, Mercy Meals has sponsored musician Mark Schultz and comedian Ken Davis as fundraisers. Mach anticipates a

large crowd for Phillips, Craig and Dean.
"They've been stalwarts in Christian music for a long time," he said. "It's a privilege to have them come. It will be a fun night and is a great way to bring in the Christmas season."
