WALL ST. RECAP

A sharp drop in the price of oil on Monday rattled investors and helped push stocks lower across several industries. Investors sold from the start of trading following a decision by OPEC last week not to cut production. Seven of the 10 sectors of the Standard and Poor's 500 index fell, led by energy shares.

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 117.12 points, or 0.7 percent, to 17,730.51.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 14.62 points, or 0.7 percent, to 2,077.07.
The Nasdaq composite dropped 40.46 points, or 0.8 percent, to 5,101.81.
FOR THE YEAR:
The Dow is down 92.56 points, or 0.5 percent.
The S&P is up 18.17 points, or 0.9 percent.
The Nasdaq is up 365.76 points, or 7.7 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for March delivery lost 1.75 cents to \$4.8275 a bushel; March corn was down 8.50 cents to 3.73 a bushel; March oats lost 4.75 cents to 2.3525 a bushel; while January soybeans declined 23.75 cents to \$8.8225 bushel.
Beef lower and pork was lower the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was off 2.07 cents to \$1.2715 a pound; January feeder cattle fell 3.00 cents to \$1.5645 a pound; while February lean hogs lost 1.58 cents to \$5.752 a pound.

More Info Released On Saturday Accident

More details have been released on an accident northeast of Yankton Saturday night that injured three people and created a power outage.
According to a spokesman from the Department of Public Safety, the accident occurred at 9:03 p.m. Saturday night. A 1994 Chevrolet 2500 pickup was traveling eastbound on 309th St. (Old Highway 50) when the vehicle reportedly swerved to miss another

vehicle. The Chevrolet ran off the road, hit a mailbox and struck a utility pole. Three people were in the vehicle. Andrew Fryer, 36, who is from Yankton and is believed to have been the driver, was transported to Avera Sacred Heart Hospital in Yankton with life-threatening injuries. Lawrence Slagle, 52, of Yankton sustained life-threatening injuries and was transported to Avera McKennan Hospital in Sioux Falls. Carlos Lopez, 32, of Yankton, sustained minor injuries.

None of the occupants of the vehicle were wearing seatbelts.
The damage to the utility pole caused more than 950 residents in Yankton to lose power for up to two hours, according to NorthWestern Energy.
The investigation is being handled by the South Dakota Highway Patrol. The Yankton County Sheriff's Office, Yankton EMS and the Yankton Fire Department also responded.

The positions will be awarded by the week of Jan. 25, 2016.
