More Info Released On Saturday Accident

More details have been released on an accident northeast of Yankton Saturday night that injured three people and created a power outage.

According to a spokesman from the Department of Public Safety, the accident occurred at 9:03 p.m. Saturday night. A 1994 Chevrolet 2500 pickup was traveling eastbound on 309th St. (Old Highway 50) when the vehicle reportedly swerved to miss another

vehicle. The Chevrolet ran off the road, hit a mailbox and struck a utility pole.

Three people were in the vehicle. Andrew Fryer, 36, who is from Yankton and is believed to have been the driver, was transported to Avera Sacred Heart Hospital in Yankton with lifethreatening injuries. Lawrence Slagle, 52, of Yankton sustained life-threatening injuries and was transported to Avera McKennan Hospital in Sioux Falls. Carlos Lopez, 32, of Yankton, sustained minor injuries.

None of the occupants of the vehicle were wearing seatbelts.

The damage to the utility pole caused more than 950 residents in Yankton to lose power for up to two hours, according to NorthWestern Energy.

The investigation is being handled by the South Dakota Highway Patrol. The Yankton County Sheriff's Office, Yankton EMS and the Yankton Fire Department also responded.


