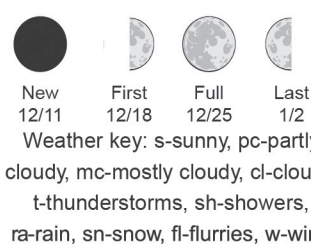

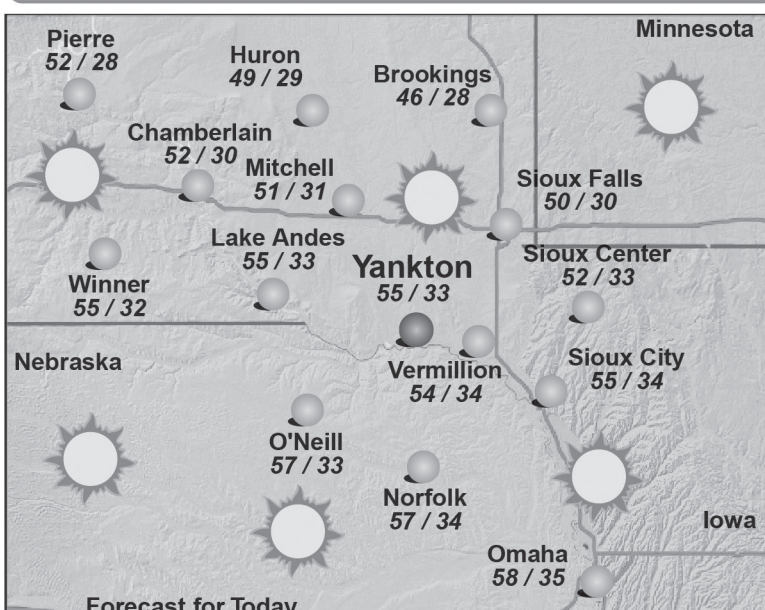

WALL ST. RECAP

A slump in technology shares on Wednesday helped turn early gains in U.S. stocks into losses across a number of industries. Seven of the 10 sectors in the Standard and Poor's 500 index fell. Suppliers of raw materials, the focus of aggressive selling in recent days, rose 3.1 percent.
