As an additional means of security, Mulhair's office has a window in direct view of the main entrance of the middle school. He can see who approaches before the entrance button is even pressed.

Sacred Heart Elementary principal Laura Haberman had a similar window installed when she became principal. "I could not see the main office at all," she said. "It has been very nice to be able to see that, especially when the secretary is busy."

Every door within both schools — including the classrooms, lunchroom and connecting doors — automatically locks upon begin shut. Although Sacred Heart Middle School is attached to parish offices and the church, all adjoining doors are locked and can only be accessed from one side.

The school also has nine different security cameras that monitor the hallways, lunchrooms and the outside perimeter.

"If I want to go into a teacher's classroom, I have to always have my keys with me," Mulhair said. "Even if I just want to go in and talk to them, I don't know if we are Fort Knox, but we've got great security."

Still, after last week's incident at YHS, Sacred Heart focused on its procedures for handling an intruder situation. On a recommendation from the Yankton Police Department, the school is incorporating two new programs of safety: the ALICE training for K-12 schools and the "I Love U Guys" crisis protocol.

These procedures for developing a high-quality school emergency operation plan cover multiple options that go beyond the lockdown-only advice, including run, hide or fight. It also recognizes that staff and students may have to use more than one option and that the decision to do so should be made using their own judgment. These methods are based on the current school environment where training takes place, giving teachers and administrators tangible visual demonstrations to best protect their school.

"We've had the skeleton of the plan, but if a shooter or a harmful person is actually in the building, what do we do?" Haberman said. "That is what the ALICE training will teach our staff. It is really about educating our staff in the real deal

and taking it a step further from where we are at."

The "I Love U Guys" Foundation offers free downloadable materials to schools and agencies that break down different actions that can be taken in school-related emergencies. These include how to initiate lockdown and lockout procedures, evacuation methods and shelter strategies.

"How we were trained to do things years ago has changed," Mulhair said. "Through some of the things that have happened the past eight or nine years, it might not be the best way anymore."

Sacred Heart also recently implemented a crisis plan committee which includes two teachers from both the middle and elementary schools, a school board member, a police officer and both principals. Haberman hopes this committee can help analyse the school's current crisis plan and have it rewritten to accommodate the updates and recent changes.

"We have a plan that is thorough right now, it's just not an ideal plan," she said. "That is the purpose of the committee. We will be looking at our floor plan, planning for different scenarios and being proactive. That is going to be the key."

The committee plans to meet once a month and schedule mock drills to get both students and staff accustomed to the new plans.

"We've had a full staff meeting and talked to them about always being aware," Haberman said. "When you are at recess, be aware who is in the parking lot. If something looks different, call in to the office and let us check it out. As a community, we need to work together. If something looks out of place, don't just assume it's OK. Don't just slide it under the rug, tell somebody."

Yankton's Missouri Valley Christian Academy (MVCA) declined an interview with the *Press & Dakotan*, but the MVCA Board of Directors released this statement regarding their security measures:

"Missouri Valley Christian Academy already has a committee formed to deal with the safety and security of our school. That committee and the school board will continue to work with local law enforcement to ensure our policies and procedures are up to date. We are always looking at ways to improve security and provide the safest possible school for our kids."
