Nebraska Sweeps BYU To Advance To NCAA Regional Final

LEXINGTON, Ky. - The fourth-seeded Nebraska volleyball team moved within one win of Omaha by sweeping 13th-seeded BYU, 26-24, 25-17, 25-23, on Friday at

Memorial Coliseum. The Huskers improved to 29-4 with their 13th win in a row and advanced to a regional final for the fourth straight year. Nebraska will face fifth-seeded Washington on Saturday at 3 p.m. (CT) in the NCAA regional final, with the winner advancing to the NCAA semifinals in Omaha next week. Saturday's regional final match will

be televised on ESPNU and streamed online at ESPN3.

The Huskers hit .279 including marks of .391 and .303 in the first two sets - and held BYU to .191 - including .067 and .160 in sets two and three. The Huskers posted 10.5 blocks, 9.5 of which came in sets two and three. BYU entered the match 17th nationally in blocking, but got to NU just seven times.

Nebraska was efficient and balanced offensively with three players at 12 kills. Amber Rolfzen had 12 kills and five blocks, while Kadie

Rolfzen had 12 kills and 12 digs for her eighth straight postseason double-double. Kelsey Fien tallied 12 kills, with eight coming in the first set, and a .310 hitting percentage. Mikaela Foecke had eight kills and four blocks, and Cecilia Hall had five kills and five blocks.

Kelly Hunter tallied 48 assists on NU's 51 kills. Hunter also had seven digs. Justine Wong-Orantes guided the Huskers' floor defense with 23 digs. Annika Albrecht had 14 digs and two kills. Kentucky native Kenzie Maloney had four digs.

BYU (28-4) got 18 kills from two-time West Coast Conference Player of the Year Alexa Gray, but the Huskers held the BYU star to .182 hitting, well below her season average of .302. Amy Boswell had eight kills and five blocks for the Cougars.

"They controlled the serve and pass battle most of the night," said WSC head coach Scott Kneifl following the match. "I'm proud of our kids as they battled and battled but it just wasn't our night."

The Wildcats have advanced to the NCAA Division II National Tournament 10 of the last 11 seasons.
