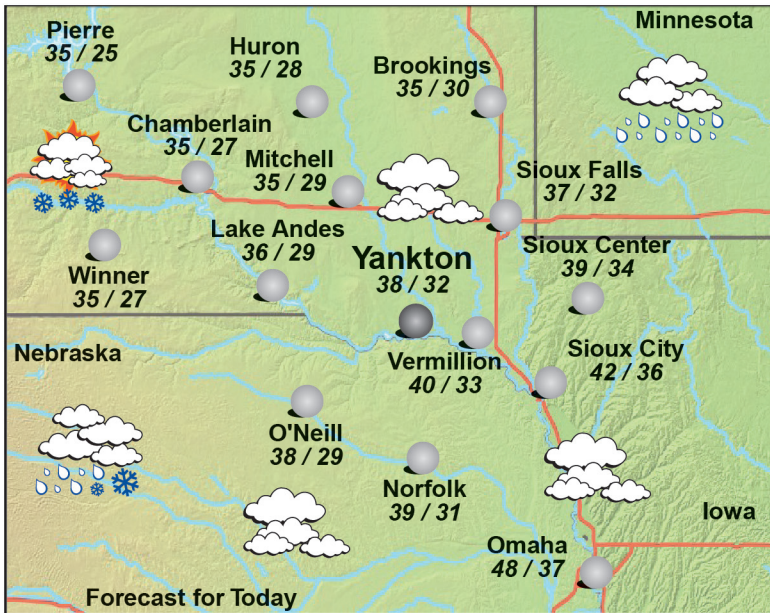

YSB To Discuss Internship Opportunities For YHS Students

At its monthly meeting Monday, the Yankton School Board will examine an opportunity for the school district to partner with YAPG and local businesses and manufacturers to provide paid internships for Yankton High School students.

The students will earn high school credit while having the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in their areas of interest. If approved, this program would begin during the spring semester of the 2015-2016 school year.

Also on the agenda for Monday, District 18 Sen. Bernie Hunhoff, Rep. Mike Stevens, and Rep. Jean Hunhoff will provide the school board with their preview of the upcoming 2016 legislative session. YSB members will have an opportunity to discuss legislation following presentations from the local

representatives.

In addition, reports will be presented from school administrators on the aspects of the different subjects and their curriculums this past month and schedule plans for December.

Yankton High School Principal Dr. Jennifer Johnke will present changes to the course catalogue including the return of AP Music Theory, alterations in CTE course descriptions and other adjustments needed to keep in compliance with graduation requirements.

Also, the Stewart Elementary School Student Council, Kathy Wagner and Melanie Ryken will discuss good news from Stewart Elementary School, YSD and Webster Elementary School.

The meeting will be held at the district administration building located at 2410 West City Limits Road. It starts at 5:30 p.m.
