Bakersfield Cools Off Coyote Men

VERMILLION — Any momentum the University of South Dakota had built over a 5-game winning streak took a little bit of a hit Saturday.

CSU Bakersfield, a California-based school in the WAC, made the plays the Coyotes weren't down the stretch in a 77-67 victory Saturday at the DakotaDome.

And those moments in particular were ones that stood out later to USD (6-4).

"I'm really disappointed in us; in our effort, execution and lack of adjustments," head coach Craig Smith said. "Just really disappointed."

It wasn't as though the Coyotes were cold from the field (they shot 48 percent), it was just that the Roadrunners were a little better down the stretch.

Bakersfield (5-3), which came with an RPI of 225, consistently answered every Coyote basket during a crucial 4-minute stretch in the

a three-pointer with 62 seconds left, with the 'Runners up 70-64. Bakersfield then scored its final seven points at the free throw line to pad the margin.

"We fought hard to come back, but we went away from what got us there," said USD point guard Shy McClelland, who referenced his own 0-of-5 effort on free throws.

Asked what USD was doing during its win streak that it didn't do Saturday, senior Eric Robertson immediately pointed to preparation.

"Today we didn't come together," said Robertson, who scored a team-high 17 points. "We weren't mentally in it like we were in the previous five games."

Foul trouble, however, limited what USD could do. Bakersfield shot 30 free throws (making 23), includ-

ing a 16-of-20 effort after

halftime. "They had a never say die attitude," McClelland said. "It's college basketball, every-

body comes to play. "We just weren't the team

That winning streak for the Coyotes had been marked by an improved defense, in Smith's eyes, but that area came up short Saturday.

"As bad as we were on offense, we were a trainwreck on defense," Smith said.

The Bakersfield duo of Kevin Mays and Aly Ahmed combined for 29 points and 16 rebounds, and Dedrick Basile scored a game-high 20 points.

While the 'Runners had a 36-20 rebounding edge thanks to its length in the post — the Coyotes were disappointed, Smith said, in how they played at home. That's been an emphasis this season, the coach added.

"It's a tough matchup in a lot of ways for us, but still a game we should take care of business on our home court," Smith said.

That focus now shifts to the road, where USD will be for the next three weeks until Summit League play begins

The Coyotes will visit Milwaukee next Thursday

the Big Ten Conference next Saturday. Then comes games at UNLV and a neutral site game Dec. 28 against Florida Gulf Coast in Sioux Falls.

What does USD have to improve on during that stretch?

"We have to bring it every day in practice," Robertson said. "Continue to work our butts off to get better, work on defense, and rebounding. "The little things that will help us win on the road."
