 move fast — he used the John Wooden adage, 'Be quick but don't hurry.'
 To aid in the search process, USD enlisted the services of a consulting firm, College Sports Solutions, an Atlanta-based outfit that assists athletic departments with coaching searches.
 Any information about USD's search was kept close to the vest, but reports came out last week that Nielson was not only among those on the short list but had been offered the position.
 Monday's announcement ended the search. And all the speculation.
 "I'm really glad he's the guy they hired," Roth said. "I've heard he's a super down to earth guy."
 He's also a guy known for turning programs into contenders.
 After doing the same thing at Minnesota-Duluth, Nielson was hired at Western Illinois in 2012 to help lead the Leathernecks back to national prominence. In his first two seasons in Macomb, Nielson's teams went 9-16 and 5-11 in the Missouri Valley, but broke through this season with five league wins.
 Slowly but surely, Nielson started to inject some life into the program, according to Scott Holland, the Sports Editor for the *McDonough County Voice* in Macomb.

Rose's Plea For Reinstatement Rejected By Manfred
 CINCINNATI (AP) — Pete Rose's application for reinstatement to baseball was rejected Monday by Commissioner Rob Manfred, who concluded the career hits leader continued to gamble even while trying to end his lifetime ban and would risk the sport's integrity if allowed back in the game.
 Rose agreed to the ban in August 1989 after an investigation for Major League Baseball by lawyer John Dowd found Rose placed numerous bets on the Cincinnati Reds to win while playing for and managing the team from 1985-87.
 In one of his first major actions, Manfred said in a four-page decision the career hits leader admitted he has kept on betting legally on horse racing and professional sports, including baseball. Manfred upheld the conclusions of the Dowd report and said MLB had obtained additional evidence not available to Dowd: a notebook of betting records from 1986 kept by Rose associate Michael Bertolini.
 "In short, Mr. Rose has not presented credible evidence of a reconfigured life either by an honest acceptance by him of his wrongdoing, so clearly established in the Dowd Report, or by a rigorous, self-aware and sustained program of avoidance by him of all the circumstances that led to his permanent ineligibility in 1989," Manfred wrote.
 Manfred said when he met with the 74-year-old Rose, the
