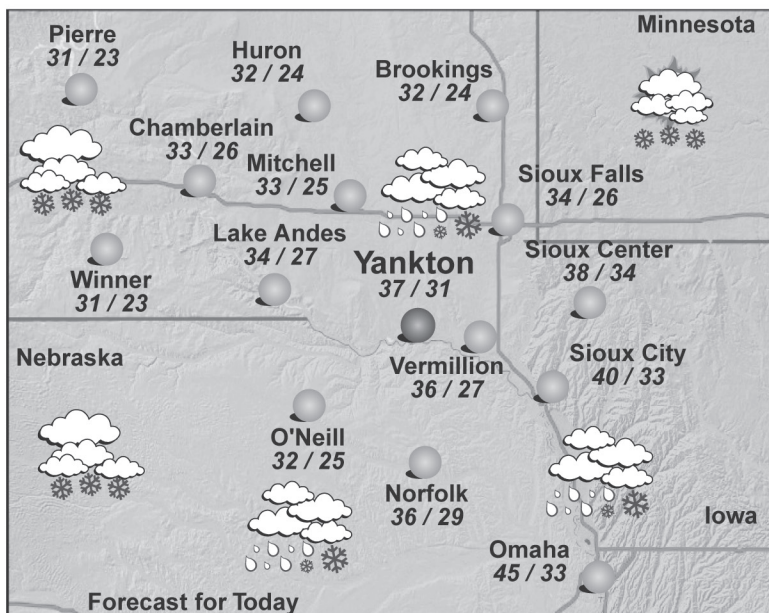

KNOX COUNTY SHERIFF'S REPORT

On Dec. 8, 2015, at about 6:26 p.m., the Knox County Sheriff's Office investigated a 2-vehicle non-injury accident located near the intersection of 549 Ave. and Highway 12, in rural Knox County. A 1991 Ford F-250 operated by Dylan Steinhoff of Hartington was pulling a 1976 International straight truck being operated by Delwin C. Walter Jr., of Crofton. The investigation determined that the straight truck ran over the tow chain; breaking the chain. The broken chain then became entangled around the right wheel of the straight truck, causing Delwin C. Walter, Jr. to lose control

and overcorrect. The straight truck overturned onto the highway and spilled its load of corn. Both lanes of traffic were blocked for approximately 1 hour, until the truck and corn could be removed with assistance of neighboring farmers. Crofton Fire and Rescue responded to the scene and provided traffic control and cleanup of the corn that remained on the highway.

* On Dec. 10, 2015, at approximately 7:47 p.m., a 2014 Jeep Grand Cherokee, driven by Cassandra Rezac of Yankton struck a cow on Highway 121 near the intersection with 893 Rd. The vehicle

was traveling northbound and the cow came from the east ditch. The vehicle was totaled and the cow was killed. Seat belts were in use and air bags deployed resulting in no injuries to Rezac or her passenger. Investigation was done on scene by the Sheriff's Office.

* On Dec. 12, 2015, the Knox County Sheriff's Office responded to an accident at 55143 881 Rd. A Dodge Durango and Chevy Cavalier were parked at Northview Park, Inc., when the Dodge Durango was struck by an agitator being pulled by a tractor. The Dodge Durango was then pushed into the Chevy

Cavalier parked next to it. The Dodge Durango and the Chevy Cavalier both received damage to the rear bumpers. The agitator didn't receive any damage.

After an indecisive day, stocks turned around in the last minutes of trading Monday and managed to end with modest gains. Last week's drop was the worst for the market since mid-August, but stocks rose over the last hour of trading and finished at their highest levels of the day.

dex gained 9.57 points, or 0.5 percent, to 2,021.94.

The Nasdaq composite index added 18.76 points, or 0.4 percent, to 4,952.23.
