

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery gained .75 cent to \$4.9425 a bushel; March corn was off 1.75 cents to 3.7725 a bushel; March oats fell 5 cents to 2.2775 a bushel; while March soybeans declined 8.25

cents at \$8.6725 bushel.

Beef was higher and pork was lower the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was up 1.12 cents to \$1.2552 a pound; January feeder cattle rose .37 cent to \$1.4852 a pound; while February lean hogs lost 1.20 cents at \$.5892 a pound.

## WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks posted their biggest gains in more than a week Tuesday, led by rising energy companies and banks. The Standard & Poor's 500 index climbed for the second day in a row, something that hadn't happened since the beginning of November.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 156.41 points, or 0.9 percent, to 17,524.91. The S&P 500 index added 21.47 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,043.41. The Nasdaq composite index rose 43.13 points, or 0.9 percent,

- Thursday, December 16, 1965**
- Yankton College's wrestling team overpowers Huron College 24-12 in a wrestling match here last night. Each squad had two pins for the night.
- Astronauts Walter Schirra and Thomas Stafford rode the Gemini 6 spaceship to a safe splashdown in the Atlantic Ocean today, skillfully eliminating the great rendezvous adventure that won the world's praise and admiration.
