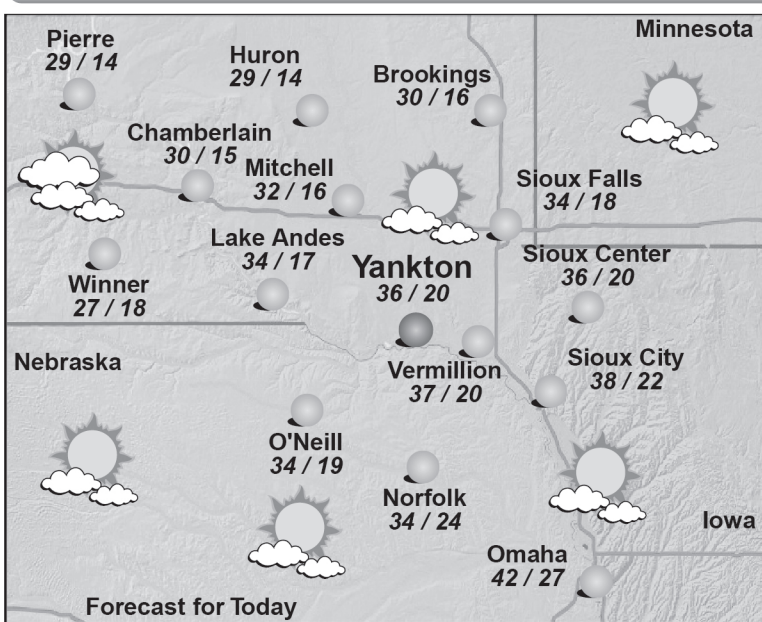

forward because then that contractor has a good foundation of knowledge to move forward on their project and teach the people that work for them, too. His method of doing business and working with customers, to me, is all about education and that's what we should be about."

Morrow, who's been Yankton's Building Official since 2003, has also worked as a building inspector for the city. He also does facility management for City Hall and the Yankton Community Library.

Morrow said the city's growth during the last 19 years has astonished him.

"When I first started here, there wasn't much north of 25th St.," he said. "The thing that I remember the most right now is driving out to 31st St. was a dirt road from about Regal Dr. to 31st St. All of those houses have been added in Willow Ridge, Ridgeway North subdivision. It's just amazing to see that growth."

Yankton City Manager Amy Nelson told the *Press & Dakotan* that she's seen Morrow rise to the challenge of his position.

"He's been nominated every year since we've had the award," Nelson said. "Joe is one of those people who puts the organization first. He really lives and breathes his position, and he has a true care and concern for everything he does. He's also the type of employee who goes above and beyond what he's asked to do."

She added that on many occasions, Morrow has tackled projects not even associated with his department.

"A lot of people don't realize all the things he does in the scope of his work," she said. "He has done things like, after hours, refurbishing old lawnmowers and delivered them to the elderly or people who have trouble purchasing that type of equipment so that they would then be able to comply with our ordinance. He recently assisted an elderly individual with a visual impairment to move from an unsafe home to a new home. All that was done without being asked or

being paid.... Because of the type of person Joe is, he saw that as a need and assisted."

Mingo said that Morrow has helped the city in many ways throughout the year.

"Joe is a 'work under the radar' kind of guy, so there isn't a lot of public splash with the sorts of things he works on on a daily basis," he said. "He designed the fire alarm system for city hall and security system for city hall. It saved the city thousands of dollars doing that design in-house rather than contracting out for it."

He added that Morrow has been on the front line for this year's rise in housing permits.

"The City of Yankton set a record number for new housing unit permits in 2015," he said. "All of those permits end up going across his desk at some point in time."

Additionally, Morrow also did critical work on application of the floodplain ordinance and review of the plans for the Avera Sister James project in 2015.

Morrow said a number of highlights come to mind from the past year.

"The highlight of 2015 is definitely getting the Westbrook Estates subdivision going out west of town," he said. "Adding the apartments, the multi-family and single family (homes). Another project that came online in 2015 was the Avera Sister James project. That is just coming to an end now but much of the work was done in 2015. The Yankton Heights 30-unit apartment project was another large project that we did. Wilson Trailer — they did a large project that they just completed. Two Thousand Fifteen has been a good year and it's fun to see the city grow."
