seemed a little uncertain and intimidated by the setting. "They waited for instruction and permission. But once we started, it didn't take them long to get going," she said. "I told them, 'You won't be judged or graded. There's no one but you here to see what you colored.' The program will continue for now, with hopes of building on attendance, she said. "We'll continue offering it the third weekend of each month through the spring," she said. Dobrovolsky has set up the room for this weekend's sessions. Four tables – two on each side of the room – feature sheets of pictures. The "artists" are offered coloring pencils, or they can choose from boxes on containing crayons and markers. For that matter, they can bring their own colors and books, she said. Dobrovolsky believes the coloring books and sheets offer something for everyone. "The variety is appealing. We have a huge variety, including owls, stained glass and a lot of nature scenes," she said. "It's hard being an adult. We want this to be comforting and to bring back childhood memories." The atmosphere promotes a peaceful feeling, Dobrovolsky said. "It's calming, soothing and quiet," she said. "We provide background music and lamps for subtle lighting. I check in to see the music stays constant, and I adjust the lighting depending on who is here and what makes them comfortable." The library set the minimum age at 18 to maintain a peaceful and uninterrupted setting, she said. "We want just adults here

The Section 502 Direct Loan Program assists low and very-low income applicants obtain decent, safe and sanitary housing in eligible rural areas. All counties in South Dakota have a maximum loan limit of \$216,840. No down payment is required, and a portion of the loan closing costs may be included in the loan. Applicants must: * Be without decent, safe and sanitary housing (not currently owned). * Be unable to obtain a loan from other resources on terms and conditions they can reasonably be expected to meet. * Agree to occupy the property as their primary residence. * Have the legal capacity to incur a loan obligation. * Meet citizenship or eligible noncitizen requirements. * Not be suspended or debarred from participation in federal programs. * Meet credit and income guidelines. * Approval amount is based on household income and monthly debt obligations.
