

recommendation. Probation options for the courts now will be limited generally to four months maximum or eight months in instances of intensive probation, with an overall combined limit of 12 months.

The court system is establishing rules in January for a grid of responses to probation violations.

State law also now calls for four common offenses - petty theft; intentional damage to property less than \$400; under age purchase, possession or consumption of alcohol by youths younger than 18; and truancy – to be handled outside the normal juvenile courts process and would be punished as citations carrying a maximum \$100 fine and restitution.

Overseeing the reform efforts is a 19-member council appointed by the governor, the Supreme Court chief justice, the Legislature's majority leaders and the attorney general.

The oversight council's chairman is Greg Sattizahn, administrator for the state Unified Judicial System. Vice chairman is Jim Seward, the governor's legal counsel and a former county prosecutor.


