Ring In The New Year Safely With AAA's Tipsy Tow

SIOUX FALLS — AAA South Dakota is offering its free Tipsy Tow service during the New Year's Eve holiday from now through 4 a.m. Jan. 2. The community service, which over the last two decades has taken thousands of drinking drivers off the roads, is available to AAA members and non-members alike, at no charge.

"Naturally, it's always a good idea to plan ahead for a sober ride or to use a designated driver if you're out partying," said Marilyn Buskohl, spokeswoman for AAA South Dakota. "But sometimes our plans change and we find ourselves unfit to drive with no alternative. That's when AAA's Tipsy Tow can save the day.

Those celebrating New Year's Eve who then feel unsafe behind the wheel can access Tipsy Tow by calling 1-800-AAA-HELP (222-4357) and asking for Tipsy Tow. AAA will come get the caller, up to one more person and the vehicle and take them home within a 15-mile radius from point of pick-up. The auto club's free service is unique in that it transports both the driver and the

"Drinking drivers frequently don't plan for other ways to get home because they are concerned about

retrieving their vehicle the next day," said Buskohl.
"They cite taxi costs and inconvenience as reasons they don't use alternate transportation. But taking a chance behind the wheel after drinking can produce deadly results. The statistics

bear this out." In 2014 in South Dakota, 583 traffic collisions were alcohol-related, resulting 47 deaths. It only takes one or two drinks to slow physical and mental skills that affect judgment, vision, steering, braking and reaction time."

Tipsy Tow is available free in Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Mitchell and Yankton.

· Always plan ahead to designate a non-drinking

driver before any party or celebration begins.

• At social events, designate non-drinking drivers who can get everyone home safely.

 Never serve alcohol to those under age 21. It's illegal and dangerous.

 Never ride as a passenger in a car driven by someone who has been drinking alcohol — even one drink.

• Call Tipsy Tow, a friend or a family member for a ride home if you've been drinking.

 Keep the cab/Tipsy Tow telephone number in your cell phone and wallet so you can easily call for a ride home.


