Free Health Screenings At Next Week's Dakota Farm Show In Vermillion

VERMILLION — Visitors and vendors at next week's Dakota Farm Show at the DakotaDome in Vermillion can receive a free health screening by faculty and students from the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine and USD's School of Health Sciences.

The painless screenings include a blood pressure check, a test of grip strength and a simple balance test.

Participants will be able to compare their results with national norms, and university experts can consult with them about their results.

The health review is part of the USD Division of Health Affairs' mission to provide health care service to residents of South Dakota and the region, especially people from rural areas. All aspects of the service are free at the screening booth that will be located in the lobby of the DakotaDome.

Nearly 300 exhibitors plan to attend the 33rd annual Dakota Farm Show, which runs Tuesday-Thursday, Jan. 5-8.

the authorized purposes of the projects and give water control orders to what the flows and power productions will be. The crew at Gavins Point Dam then implement those choices.

Knowing how far in advance a flood will strike varies, according to Becker.

"It depends where the water's coming from and where the problem is at," he said. "Sometimes they have a lot of time to steady it and make decisions, other times they have very little."

The snowfall of the last month hasn't changed much with the water flow at Gavins Point.

"There haven't been much flooding issues this year, and lately, there hasn't been many flood concerns," said Becker.

South Dakota households use VoIP — that is, Voice over Internet Protocol — and 40 percent have only wireless telephone service.

PUC staff members working on the docket have questioned some of the companies' assertions.

For example regulators cited statistics indicating 24 percent of South Dakota households don't have high-speed Internet access.

CenturyLink and Dex Media responded to 10 sets of follow-up questions from PUC staff. CenturyLink said it charges \$3.99 per directory-listing check and doesn't have a business relationship with a toll-free directory service that it identified as an alternative.

Parts of the answer to one question were treated by the companies as confidential information that wasn't publicly available.

Wheat for March delivery lost 6 cents to \$4.6975 a bushel; March corn lost 3.50 cents to 3.59 a bushel; March oats were 2.25 cents lower to 2.1825 a bushel; while March soybeans gained 4.25 cents to \$8.7025 bushel.

Beef higher and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was up 1.20 cents to \$1.3670 a pound; March feeder cattle gained 3.48 cents to \$1.6595 a pound; while February lean hogs rose .62 cent to \$.5977 a pound.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, December 31, 1965

Yankton and Aberdeen were winners in the closeout of the 1965 portion of the Eastern South Dakota conference basketball season.

Deaths on the nation's highways in the first hours of the extended New Year weekend were running below the pace of the same period in last week's Christmas holiday. At least 61 persons were killed in traffic accident since the start of the 78-hour holiday period at 6p.m. Thursday.

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, December 31, 1990

Brad Lhotak's win in the championship round highlighted Wagner's fifth-place finish in the Lincoln Senior High School Wrestling Tourney, held Saturday and Sunday in Sioux Falls. Wagner finished with 127 points, while Yankton tallied 93 for the two-day affair.

About 100 horseback riders and several hundred others watched as spiritual ceremonies were conducted in sub-zero temperatures Saturday morning at the grave site of Sioux Indians killed by U.S. Cavalry troops a century ago.
