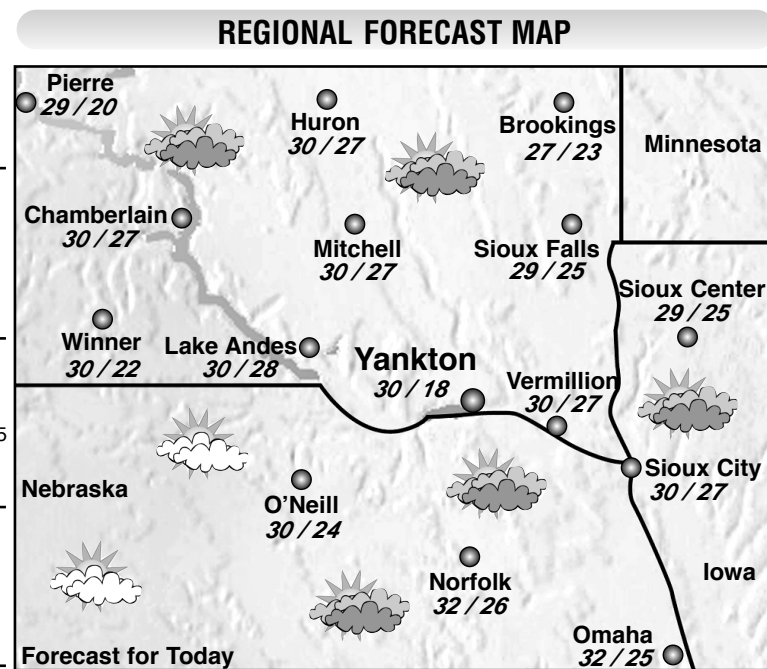

"I think (this discussion) is happening now because there are more than one or two people who could have a conflict," Specht said Friday during a media briefing.
