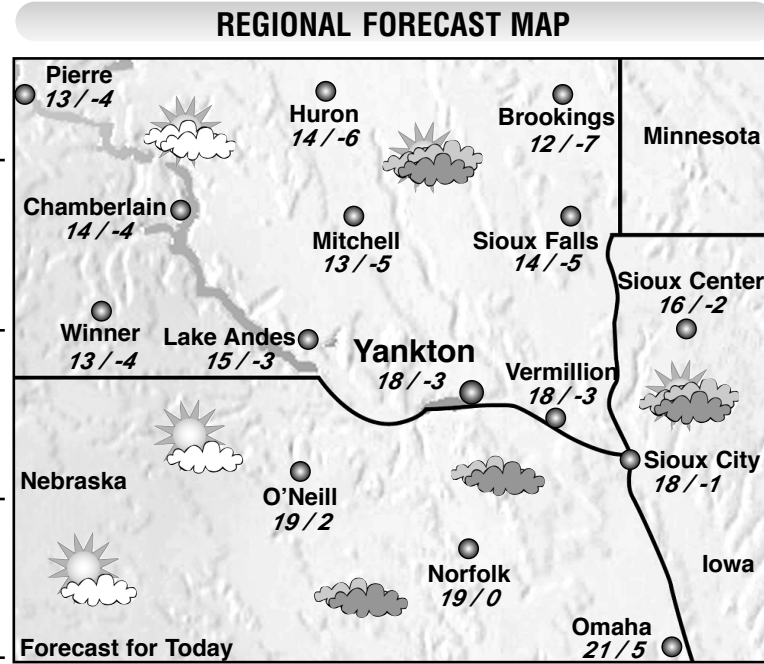

70-80 absences per day at the high school. That makes a lot of work for the secretaries getting all of the work together to be picked up, and then most of the students don't have the work done when they return the next day.

By school policy, students have two days for every day missed to finish work that was assigned while absent. According to both Kindle and middle school principal Cathy Wagner, this needs to be changed.

"Attendance and punctuality are skills that employers say is one of the most important skills to have coming out of school," Kindle said. "There are students with legit excuses, but we need to address those students who are habitual offenders."

After hearing the principals' reports, the board decided to appoint a district-wide committee consisting of law enforcement, the state's attorney, parents, teachers, students and board members to consider how to revise the policy.

During the meeting, the board also approved a temporary boundary change to allow a pre-

school age student to attend the Bon Homme School District, as open enrollment is not allowed for students of that age.

The district also presented the results of the 16th annual Safe and Drug Free Schools survey Monday night.

According to Yankton student services director Joyce Wentworth, the results this year are consistent with results from past year's surveys.

"We have found that the results have stayed very similar or student responses have decreased in most areas," Wentworth said. "We were recently notified that there was no funding for the drug and alcohol education programs in this year's budget. The good thing is, in the past, we have invested in programming, but for the future there will probably not be the teacher education opportunities."

Other business covered included:

- hearing a report on the student population trends in regards to how it will affect funding in the future; and
- hearing a report on the 2010 YHS Enriched Summer School Program.
