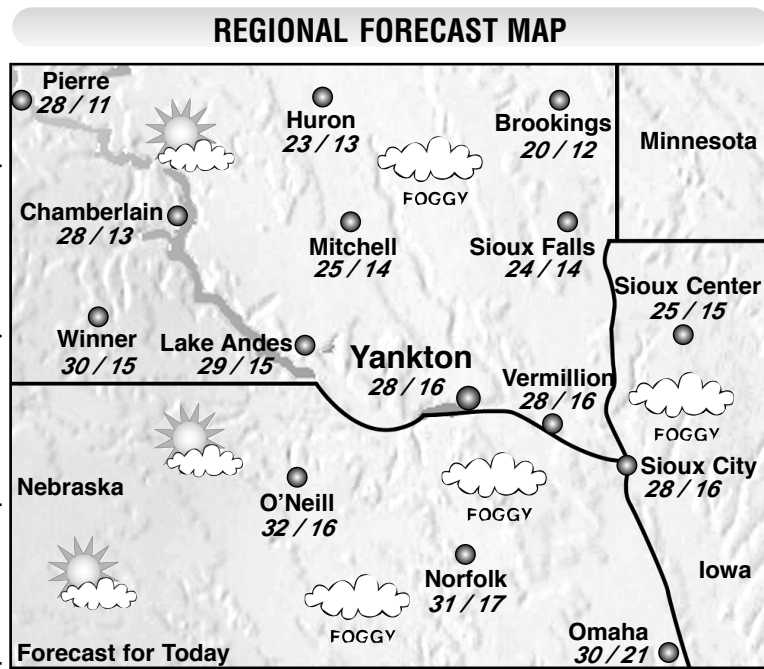

The Kearney Hub newspaper reported that between 30 and 40 employees and customers left the bank through a side door late Wednesday morning. A photo on the paper's Web site showed a man coming out of the bank later with his hands in the air. Angie Kaipust, a spokeswoman for Nebraska's Wells Fargo branches, said the bank was cooperating with authorities, but declined to discuss details. Kearney is about 185 miles west of Omaha.

challenge if the proposal passes. Anderson and other union officials said federal law likely would supersede a state measure. Senate Democratic Leader Scott Heidepriem of Sioux Falls said he believes in secret ballots but doubts the state constitution should be amended to fight a pending measure in Congress. "I think the secret ballot is the heart of a democratic system," he said. Knudson said he and other lawyers believe the proposed amendment would not be preempted by federal law. A state measure is not prevented by federal law if a state is protecting a significant interest and is not placing an undue burden on federal regulations, he said. Mark Anderson of the South Dakota Federation of AFL-CIO said the measure is being promoted by an out-of-state business group that wants South Dakota to foot the bill for a legal

### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Agriculture futures rose Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for March delivery jumped 14.5 cents to \$4.9675 a bushel; March corn climbed 3.25 cents to \$3.6175 a bushel; March oats added 2.25 cents to \$2.3225 a bushel; and March soybeans gained 13 cents to \$9.375 a bushel. Meanwhile, livestock futures traded higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle added 0.07 cent to 88.82 cents a pound; March feeder cattle rose 0.28 cent to 100.25 cents a pound; February lean hogs gained 0.38 cent to 67.90 cents a pound; and February pork bellies traded up 1.45 cents to 84.50 cents a pound.
