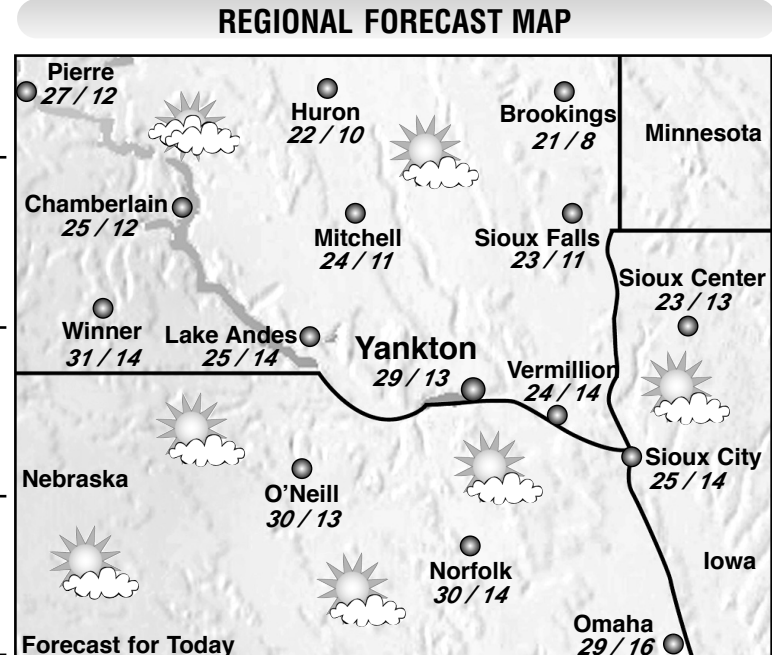

authority granted to it under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act to the State of South Dakota to be used on the project.

The bill was passed unanimously by the Senate and will now need to be approved in the House.

Later in the afternoon, the delegation had a private audience with Gov. Mike Rounds who, since he will be forced by term limits to leave office this year, said he will miss his annual visit with Yankton and Vermillion residents.

"I've always enjoyed my discussions with you folks," Rounds said. "This is the last time I get to do that. I appreciate the discussions and you coming up to participate with the legislative body."

The governor was asked by Yankton City Manager Doug Russell what the city can do to continue its efforts with the Governor's Office of Economic Development to recruit businesses related to the archery industry.

"I think you have to come up with your business plan about what you want to be to the industry," Rounds said. "I think you then bring that plan to the Office of Economic Development and show them your commitment. Ask for a similar commitment from them with regards to projects you want to get accomplished."

During his administration, Rounds said the state has identified specific industries to learn more about and attract.

"It's amazing, once you get to be an expert in their industry, they recognize that and have real interest," he said. "Archery is one of those, and Yankton has done a really good job of becoming a key player in terms of national archery activity. It's going to grow. Think about what it does, not just for economic development and tourism, but about the quality of life it provides for your people as they become actively engaged in that type of outdoor recreational activity. I would suspect that, as the interest in archery is identified and more acutely recognized, you will find more people taking time to do it themselves."

The governor also fielded a question about the status of the Hyperion oil refinery project. The air quality permit was recently approved, but more permits will be needed before the refinery can proceed. Also, a water supplier will have to be acquired.

Some construction is expected to begin during 2011 but the heavy lifting probably won't get under way until 2012, Rounds said.

"Their business plan appears to be solid yet," he continued. "I'd just as soon have it being done here and have the citizens of South Dakota be able to take

advantage of part of the huge economic impact it has. I think Yankton will benefit from that, as well."

The serious atmosphere of the visit with the governor was lightened when a teacher from Vermillion asked on behalf of the students present at the meeting whether an executive order could be issued to forgive the six days of school they have missed because of inclement weather. The audience, including the governor, erupted with laughter.

"Nice try," Rounds said jokingly. "I've had a couple of those requests already, actually."

During many of the meetings with state officials Wednesday, potential budget cuts hung like a black cloud over many plans. It was no exception during a session with Secretary of GF&P Jeff

Vonk and Doug Hofer, director of the Division of Parks and Recreation.

Hofer spoke of the proposed expansion of the campgrounds at the Lewis and Clark Recreation Area. He said the department feels the 32 sites in question could be built economically without creating a crowded situation.

"That's in our budget," he said. "But those are some of the things that might be in jeopardy if we did have to make cuts in general funds. I think everybody's priority has to be to operate what we have and do a good job of that."

However, Hofer pointed to some good news for the Yankton area. The department is currently spending approximately \$500,000 to remodel the restaurant at the Lewis and Clark Marina.

"That restaurant had a lot of issues on the interior and exterior," he said. "There are a lot of things that the architect ... did to make it a more functional building. Hopefully, that will make it a better business. It's a pretty big commitment on behalf of the department to upgrade that building."
