**YANKTON COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING**  
January 20, 2010

The regular meeting of the Yankton County Commission was called to order by Chairman Bruce Jensen at 4:30 PM on Wednesday, January 20, 2010.

Roll Call was taken with the following Commissioners present: Donna Freng, Bruce Jensen, Mark Johnson, Allen Sinclair and Bill Tamisiea.

**Action 1024C:** A motion was made by Tamisiea and seconded by Johnson to set the agenda with the following additions/changes: Executive Session for Indigent requests and a personnel matter. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

**Action 1025C:** A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Tamisiea to approve the minutes of the January 5, 2010 meeting of the Board. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Jackie Husman, Community Health Nurse, presented the quarterly report for the Community Health office.

**Action 1026N:** A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Tamisiea to accept into the record the quarterly report of the Community Health Nurse office. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Lori Mackey, Director of Equalization, introduced Michelle Goeken, recently hired for the vacant appraiser position. Mackey also reported 2010 valuations will be mailed out around the last week of February.

**Action 1027C:** A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Johnson to recess the regular meeting of the Board and convene in Executive Session to address a personnel matter and indigent requests. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

**Action 1028C:** A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Freng to reconvene in regular session. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Chairman Jensen announced no action would be taken as a result of the Executive Session.

The Yankton Area Ice Association made a request for financial assistance from the County. The request was for \$15,000 per year for four (4) years. The Board discussed the request and advised the 2010 budget has been adopted, but the request will be considered at year's end.

Pat Garrity, Zoning Administration, presented an overview of the County Nuisance Ordinance.

**Action 1029Z:** A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to authorize Garrity to proceed with publication of the Ordinance regulations. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Garrity also advised the Board of the progress on resolution of the Fiedler/Vesper zoning issue. The resolution agreement reached on December 10, 2009 includes a work plan by a contractor to meet cosmetic and structural siding and roof expectations, location and siting of accessory structure per site plan provided with Building Permit #1174 (completion date of June 1, 2010), installation of siding and roof per work plan agreement (completion date of August 15, 2010), and funding by Yankton County to accomplish the above and payment of Mr. Vesper's attorney's fees.

The first reading of Article 14 Amendment to the Yankton County Zoning Ordinance was held at 5:30 PM as scheduled: Ordinance No 2010 IPZ ~ An Ordinance Amending Ordinance #16 ~ Regarding Article 14 (Signage). The second reading will be scheduled for the February 2nd, 2010 County Commission meeting.

Fred Binder, District III, advised the Board the Energy Grant applications are due in Pierre on January 29, 2010. Binder further advised financial participation by grant applicants will be advantageous to the process. Binder advised that if the County could commit to funding \$166,325 of the total request of \$500,000+, the County would have a better chance of being approved for grant dollars requested.

**Action 1030C:** A motion was made by Tamisiea and seconded by Johnson to approve the energy grant request as presented by Fred Binder and further to commit County funds in the amount of \$166,325 as the County's share of the proposed energy savings project. The ambulance report for the month of December 2009 was presented by Steve Hawkins. The department responded to 116 calls in December with 87 1st calls, 28 2nd/3rd calls, 1 standby and 16 transfers. \$78,851 was billed out in December and \$51,290 was received in for December.

Hawkins requested permission to purchase a new monitor/defibrillator (Life Pack 15), as budgeted, for \$24,682.90, using Life Pack 12 for trade-in.

**Action 1033A:** A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Johnson to declare Life Pack 12 as surplus property to be used for trade-in on the purchase of Life Pack 15. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

Hawkins discussed the delay in delivery of the new ambulance and further advised that his recommendation is that ambulance #794 not be traded in as originally planned. As this vehicle is the department's only 4 x 4, Hawkins feels it would be in the best interest of the County to keep the vehicle in the inventory in the event of compromised road travel.

**Action 1034A:** A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Sinclair to rescind the action to use ambulance #794 as a trade-in and to retain the vehicle in the department's inventory. Voting Aye: All Nay: None Motion carried.

**Murder Case Delayed By 'Aquash' Box Discovery**

Thirty-four years after Annie Mae Aquash's frozen body was found on a South Dakota Indian reservation, the federal case against a man accused of assisting in her killing has been further delayed due to the discovery of a box of evidence in the basement of the Denver Police Department.

The attorney for Richard Marshall says the collection of files and recordings labeled "Aquash" — whose existence police revealed to prosecutors in late January — are new to the case.

Marshall is charged with murder and aiding and abetting in the death of Aquash, who moved to the Pine Ridge Reservation from Nova Scotia in 1973 during the American Indian Movement's 71-day occupation of Wounded Knee. Prosecutors say AIM leaders suspected she was an FBI informant and ordered her killing in 1975. Prosecutors have said she was not working for the government.

Marshall's trial had been scheduled to begin Tuesday in Rapid City, but defense attorney Dana Hanna asked for more time to review the new information. On Thursday U.S. District Judge Lawrence Piersol ordered from the bench that the trial be moved to April 13.

"I have discussed the need for a continuance with my client Richard Marshall and he agrees with my advice and opinion that a continuance is necessary to confront his accusers and to present evidence in his defense effectively," Hanna wrote.

Neither Hanna nor federal prosecutors would comment about the case. State prosecutors have said John Graham and two other AIM members — Arlo Looking Cloud and Theda Clarke — abducted Aquash in Denver and drove her to Rapid City, where she was held against her will and questioned about whether she was an informant.

Prosecutors allege Graham raped Aquash and later fatally shot her. Marshall's alleged role in the murder is not clear in court documents. Graham has pleaded not guilty in state court to one count of felony murder in relation to kidnapping, one count of felony murder in relation to rape and one count of premeditated murder.

Looking Cloud, a key witness in Marshall's case, was convicted as an accomplice in 2004 and is serving a life sentence. Clarke, also expected to testify, has not been charged. She's in her 80s and lives in a nursing home in western Nebraska. Denver police have acknowledged some records from the case were destroyed in 2001. In December, Piersol ordered prosecutors to contact Denver authorities to determine what evidence was gathered and what evidence was destroyed.

**Hickey To Start U.S. House Campaign**

SIoux FALLS (AP) — Steve Hickey of Sioux Falls says he'll kick off his candidacy Tuesday for the Republican nomination to run for South Dakota's lone U.S. House seat.

Hickey is founding pastor of Church At The Gate and Go Kids! Daycare in Sioux Falls.

He describes himself as a strong advocate of small business and a small business entrepreneur.

Also seeking the Republican nomination are Blake Curd, a surgeon and state representative, and Secretary of State Chris Nelson.

They'll face off in a June primary that will determine who will face Rep. Stephanie Herseth Sandlin, a Democrat, in the fall election.

**Deaf School Campus Future Unclear**

SIoux FALLS (AP) — The Board of Regents is looking at future uses for the School for the Deaf campus in Sioux Falls after the handful of students still there go elsewhere for their education.

The options include leasing parts of the 14-acre campus or selling it. It's valued at nearly \$10 million.

The regents plan to send the five remaining students to a mainstream school or another state's residential deaf school.

Regents Executive Director Jack Warner said selling the land would require legislative approval. The sale proceeds would go to the School and Public Lands Endowment.

**Professors Examine 'Sexing' Laws**

MITCHELL (AP) — An assistant professor at Dakota Wesleyan University says juveniles run the risk of extreme penalties because state laws aren't keeping up with so-called "sexting."

That's the practice of sending illicit photos or videos electronically, generally by cell phone. Sometimes it can result in child pornography charges.

DWU's Jesse Weins and a colleague in Kansas have written a law review article that suggests a model law creating a base misdemeanor charge for sexting. It leaves room to consider aggravating circumstances like photos that are distributed to earn money or for revenge.

Weins says there shouldn't be a one-size-fits-all law because sexting takes different forms.

**Dell Rapids School Could Finish Soon**

DELL RAPIDS (AP) — The school superintendent in the southeastern South Dakota town of Dell Rapids says design work for a new elementary could take about three months, with construction bids opened in June or July.

Superintendent Tom Ludens estimates construction will start in August and be finished by fall 2011.

School district voters earlier this month approved an \$11 million bond issue to pay for the 82,000-square-foot school. It was the fifth time a proposed new school had been on the ballot.

**Man Gets Prison For Sexual Assault**

MADISON, Neb. (AP) — A 19-year-old Bloomfield man was given 8-to-12 years in prison for sexually assaulting a girl.

Judge James Kube of Madison County District Court also told William Yunker Jr. during sentencing on Friday that Yunker will have to register as a sex offender when he leaves prison.

The mother of the girl read the court a statement about how the crime had affected her family and how the sexual abuse had continued for more than a year.

Yunker's mother asked the judge to give her son a chance at probation, saying he was an asset to the community.

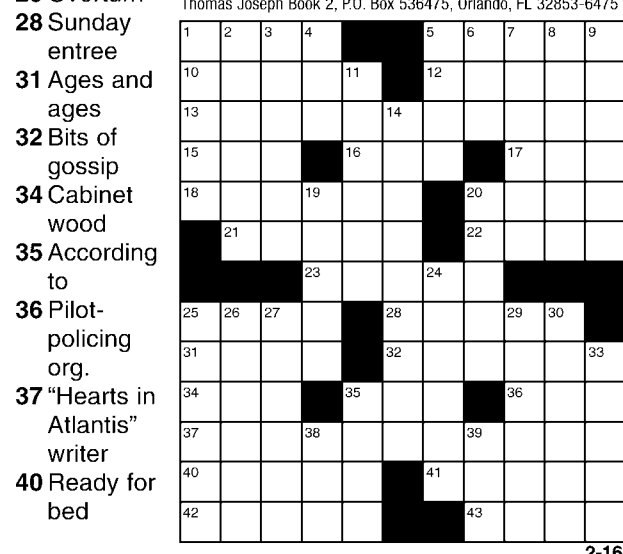

One letter stands for another. In this sample, A is used for the three L's, X for the two O's, etc. Single letters, apostrophes, the length and formation of the words are all hints. Each day the code letters are different.
