On the women's side, sophomore Elizabeth Hoffman also boasts a number of top five times in various events heading into the championship meet. Hoffman, whose sister Alexandra swims at SDSU, has the third-best time in the 100-meter freestyle, 200 freestyle and 500 freestyle. She also ranks fifth in the 400-meter individual medley. "She's sitting very well in all her events," Mahowald said. "And I think our relays could be a pleasant surprise. We haven't been able to put our four best girls together at the same time yet, but I think we can now." With Oakland predicted to again handily win the Summit League title, Mahowald said he believes there's a chance for a team like USD to have a strong weekend and come away with a top-three finish. Still, there's the whole issue of being new to the party. "We've seen them on paper all

year, but we haven't actually seen any of these kids yet," Mahowald said. "It's an unknown, but an exciting unknown. After this weekend, I'm sure we'll have some new rivalries in the pool."
Home Hoops This Weekend
Following a much-anticipated non-conference game for the women and a week off for the men, the USD basketball teams return to the DakotaDome this weekend. The Coyotes host Utah Valley in a Great West Conference doubleheader tonight (Thursday), starting with the women's game at 6 p.m. And then the USD women will host Southern Illinois Edwardsville on Sunday at 2 p.m. For the Coyote women, coming off a 67-48 loss to in-state rival South Dakota State on Monday, it's back to the conference grind. "It was fun to have a SDSU game mid-week like that, but now it's back to business," USD coach Ryan Williams said Wednesday, after his speech at Yankton's Quarterback Club luncheon. "We've got to continue to move up in the standings, and our kids realize that."

USD (10-12) sits fifth in the Great West with a 3-3 conference record, while tonight's opponent, Utah Valley, is 5-20 overall and 1-7 in league play. The Coyotes defeated the Wolverines 65-56 on Jan. 21 in Orem, Utah. Though the Coyotes rank sixth in the Great West in scoring (57.6 ppg), they are the top defensive team, allowing a league-low 58.5 ppg. "It's had to be consistent for us," Williams said of the defense. "We've had our struggles scoring the ball, but we're continuing to work on that. We take a lot of pride on that end of the floor. We have kids that really understand our system." On the men's side, first-place USD will look to exact revenge on Utah Valley tonight (Thursday) at 8 p.m. The Coyotes (14-9, 5-1 GWC) lost to the Wolverines 86-68 on Jan. 21 in Orem, Utah, for their first — and only loss — setback in league play. Utah Valley comes into tonight's game 11-13 overall and 4-4 in the GWC. USD leads the league in scoring (79.5), shooting percentage (.485) and three-point percentage (.369).

SIoux CENTER, Iowa — With a chance to move up the league standings, the Mount Marty College men's basketball team couldn't hold off runs by the hosts, as Dordt repeated the Lakers 68-54 in Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC) action Wednesday night in Sioux Center, Iowa. The loss drops Mount Marty to 6-22 overall and 4-13 in league play, with one final regular season contest remaining. The Defenders began the game on a 10-0 run, as the Lakers didn't score until a three-pointer by Stephen Klekas at the 15:31 mark. MMC would then claw back to pull ahead 20-16 with 8:21 left in the half. Yet, Dordt manufactured another 10-0 run to take a 26-20 lead. At halftime, the Defender cushion was 28-22. To start the second half, the two teams went back and forth until Dordt found a groove to lead 43-33 with 12:19 to play. MMC cut the deficit to 47-40 with 9:08 to play, but again, the Defenders mounted a rally. At the 7:15 mark, the Defenders held a 56-40 lead — one of three 16-point cushions in the second half. Justin Peters led Mount Marty with 12 points, while Klekas and Jeff Viereck both had eight points. Trey Krier, Weston Kusser and Jared Wall all scored six points, while Wall pulled down a team-

high six rebounds. MMC shot 43.1 percent (22-of-51) from the field in the game, including a 5-of-13 clip on three-pointers and a 5-of-10 effort at the free throw line.
