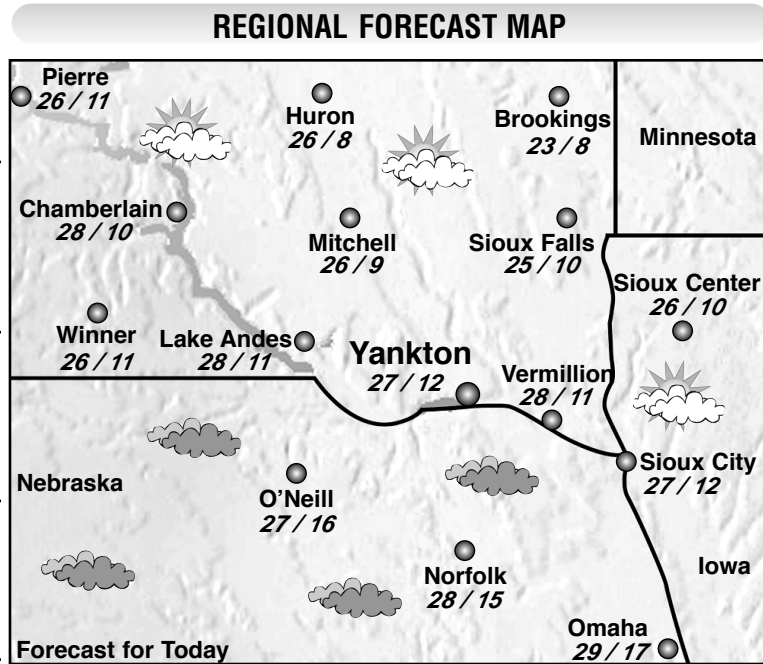

The Yankton City Commission will hold a public hearing Monday to get input on a plan unveiled last month for the Memorial Park pool. The two-phase plan is estimated to cost \$5.7 million, and there are no intentions to move forward with the project at the present time. Instead, commissioners have said they are looking to finalize a master plan for the pool that could possibly be implemented at a later date when economic conditions are more favorable. Also Monday, the commission will consider a conditional-use permit for a community and education center being proposed by Sacred Heart Catholic Church for the 500 block of Capital Street. The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.
