Crofton In Seventh Entering Final Day Of State Class C Wrestling Tourney
OMAHA, Neb. — Crofton's Nathan Merchen and Dominic Miller each advanced to their respective finals at the Nebraska Class C Wrestling Tournament Friday at the Qwest Center in Omaha, Neb.

Crofton's two finalists have them in seventh place entering the final day, at 57 points. Creighton-Verdigre has 16 points, while Hartington Cedar Catholic has 11 points.

Merchen topped Toby Thompson of Loomis-Bertrand 8-3 in the 125-pound semifinals. He will face Battle Creek's Karl Bonner in the final today (Saturday).

Miller needed overtime to claim a 12-7 victory over Kearney Catholic's Michael Rogers. He will face Joseph's Tackle of Humphrey St. Francis in the final.

Three other wrestlers saw their title hopes dashed in the semifinals, Creighton-Verdigre's Landon Pospisil at 171 pounds, Cedar Catholic's Chad Koch at 189 pounds and Crofton's Isiah Williams at 215 pounds. All three will wrestle in consolation action today, and will finish in the top six.

Four other area wrestlers were eliminated in consolation action Friday.

Gymnastics: Watertown Rolls To AA Title; Gazelles 12th

ABERDEEN — The Watertown Arrows posted a score of 150.145 to coast to the Class AA title at the South Dakota State Gymnastics Meet Friday at Aberdeen Central High School. Sioux Falls Lincoln finished a distant second at 144.78. Rapid City Central was third at 143.394. Yankton-Bon Homme finished 12th with 130.294, led by junior Sam Wampol's all-around score of 33.582. She had the Gazelles' best scores in the vault (8.7), floor exercise (8.583) and balance beam (8.183). Senior Jordan Leader had the Gazelles' best mark on the uneven parallel bars with an 8.483. The tournament concludes today with the individual competition.

Class A Madison extended its national record title run to 16 straight with a two-point victory over Deuel in the team competition Friday morning. Madison, which did not come in with the top region score for the first time in over a decade, finished with a team score of 141.927. Deuel was second at 139.810, with Britton-Hecla (134.595) a distant third. Wagner placed seventh with a score of 127.443. Vermillion placed ninth, scoring a 124.814.

Maybe the biggest match before Mart-Saylor's was Chris Mart's 18-3 technical fall over Yankton's Iden Ramey to give Vermillion 163.5 points. "All of those matches were big for us; we knew we would win a few of those, but you never know for sure," Delvaux said. "It was good to get those wins and I don't know what to say because I am just spent right now." One of the reasons Delvaux was spent had to deal with the fact Vermillion has fallen just short of the region title the last four years, and he told the team to take a different approach coming into the second day trailing Yankton 137 to 129. "When we walked off the bus, I told them not to worry about the team title," he said. "I told them to wrestle loose and they went out there and wrestled their heart out there."

Vermillion will send a total of 10 wrestlers to the South Dakota State Class A Tournament next weekend in Aberdeen. The Tanagers are ranked third in Class A and are trailing top-ranked Sturgis and Rapid City Stevens. Delvaux said he will give the team the weekend off in preparation for state. "If it were tomorrow, I would be worried about it, but with the weekend over, this emotion can carry to the state tournament," he said. "We will take the weekend off and enjoy it and winning the region after four close years in a row feels good, but we are now going to focus on doing well at state." Yankton will also send 10 wrestlers to the state tournament, led by region champions Jake Dempsey (fifth ranked) at 135-pounds and Gabe Messler (sixth ranked) at 140-pounds. "Those are two of our senior leaders and their hard work is showing up at the end of the season," Hage said. "They have worked hard and I am happy for them and everyone who is heading to state."
