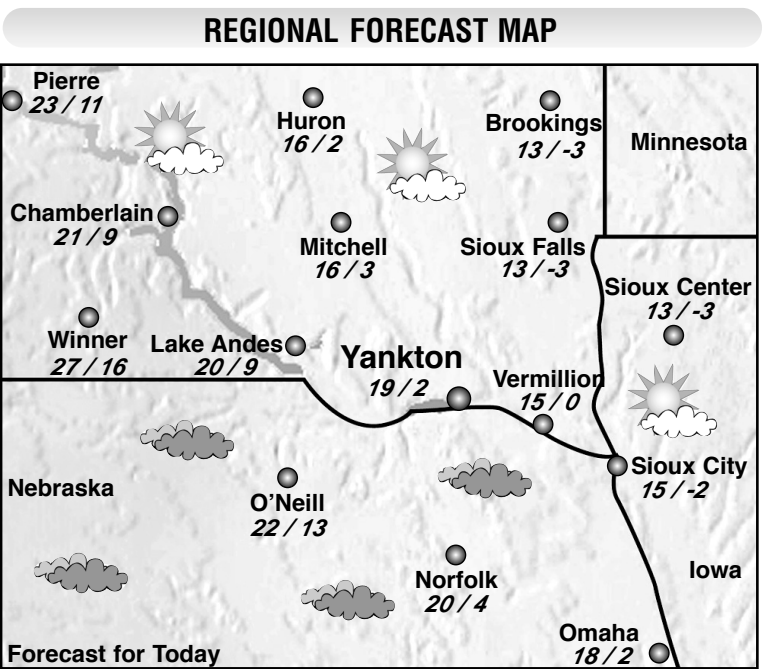

Comedic Duo To Headline The Center's Annual 'Wine and Dine'

Nobody needs a reason to chuckle more than Yankton area residents who have been buried under one of the longest winters in recent memory.

To do its part in breaking the winter doldrums, The Center is bringing the comedic duo of Tina and Lena to its annual Wine and Dine event, set for Friday at the Hillcrest Country Club.

"We are trying to be upbeat and keep everyone entertained," said center Director Tammy Matuska. "With all the snow this year, we decided that comedy was the way to go, so we brought in the Tina and Lena show. Tina and Lena are a comedy duo from Minnesota, they do singing, some jokes, they tell some Norwegian skits. They also involve the audience to participate."

Billed as two of the funniest, zaniest ladies you'll ever meet, Tina and Lena are in the full-time business of making people laugh out loud. According to their Web site, they bring an engaging variety show that is a blend of clever to cornball comedy, musical har-

mony and spirited antics.

"We just want people to come out and have a bit of fun," Matuska said. "We have six different wines that they normally serve at Hillcrest that we will be sampling, then other beverages will be on your own. It is not an all-night wine event. This year we are not doing a meal; rather we are sampling the hors d'oeuvres all night — from fruit to a spinach dip, to a prime bruschetta. We have a good variety of things we are going to offer."

Matuska pointed out that the variety of hors d'oeuvres include meatless varieties because the event is being held on a Friday during Lent.

This is the third year that The Center has held the Wine and Dine event as a fund-raiser to help with operation costs.

"We are membership-based facility, so to allow our operations to continue as they are, we need to do a few large fundraisers," Matuska said. "This is a function that is open to the public, it is not members only. We are encouraging people to come out and enjoy the night."

After the wine-tasting and the comedy show, there will also be a live auction for items donated to the event.

"We also have 17 items to auction off, ranging from pictures, to wine baskets, to make-up baskets," Matuska said. "We have jewelry that has been hand-carved by Indians in Arizona. We also have some Twins ticket and Kansas City Royals ticket packages. They are great packages and if you are a Twins or Royals fan, you will be very excited to see what is included."

The wines tasted during the evening's event can be ordered through HyVee for pick-up at a later date or the organizers will be selling full bottles of the sample wines at the auction.

"We will be starting the wine tasting at 5:30 p.m.," Matuska said. "At 7 p.m., Tina and Lena will take the stage, followed by the auction at 8 p.m."

Matuska warned that most of the available tickets have been sold, so if you are interested in attending get your tickets beforehand. Any tickets left will be available at the door. Further ticket information is available on The Center's Web site www.yanktoncenter.org or by calling 605-665-4685.
