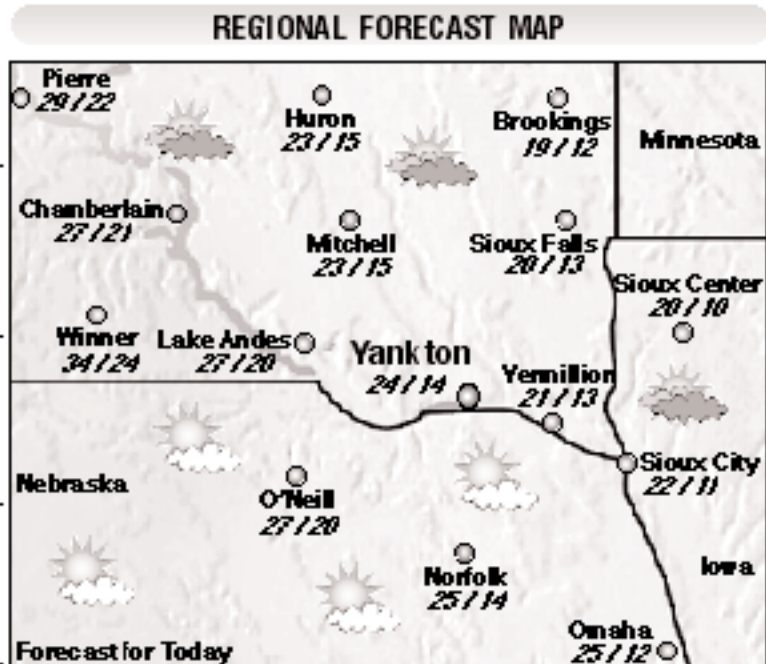

Monday, February 25, 1935
• Blizzards, tornadoes and dust storms — a strange weather mixture — marked their passage with death in the Midwest today. Four were killed and more than 130 injured by storms that struck between the Mississippi and the Rockies.
