AREA MOVIES

AVATAR (Y) ★★1/2. James Cameron's mega-expensive, technological marvel is also a whole lot of fun: A gamer generation's "Dances With Wolves," with a human soldier (and his avatar) falling in love with a blue-skinned alien from the planet Pandora 2 hr. 42 PG-13 (violence, aggressive action, alien beasts, adult themes).

COP OUT (Y-Ve) ★1/2. This is a clumsy postmodern buddy cop flick that stuffs as many genre references as it can into the ceaseless patter between Tracy Morgan and Bruce Willis. They play our paired police — detectives Paul Hodges and Jimmy Monroe, respectively — and they might as well be in different movies. Willis is our unmistakable straight man. Almost charmingly, he's actually trying to solve crimes. Hodges, however, is a parody. Realism is far in the rearview whenever Morgan is on screen and one can't help wondering how his partner — let alone his wife (Rashida Jones) — can treat a cartoon so much like a human. Director Kevin Smith gives Morgan, the former "Saturday Night Live" cast member and current "30 Rock" co-star, copious room to let loose. He's the kind of comedian who's naturally funny; bottling him is foolish. Rated R for pervasive language including sexual references, violence and brief sexuality. Running time: 110 minutes.

DEAR JOHN (Y-Vi) ★★ Moist, star-crossed romance from the Nicholas Sparks novel. It features the attractive and sensitive Amanda Seyfried and Channing Tatum

as young lovers separated by war and duty. Lasse Hallstrom's movie opens promisingly, but fails to build, as though focused on the wrong end of the hourglass. 1 hr. 45 PG-13 (sensuality, battle scenes).

EXTRAORDINARY MEASURES (T) ★★ A father (Brendan Fraser) struggles for a treatment for his terminally-ill children. Though inspired by a gripping, true-life story, as brought to screen by Tom Vaughan (What Happens in Vegas), it's a sick, well-meaning disease-of-the-week drama of the sort one might encounter on the Hallmark Channel. Harrison Ford co-stars as a scientist as prickly as Fraser is tender. 1 hr. 45 PG (dramatic themes).

PERCY JACKSON AND THE OLYMPIANS: THE LIGHTNING THIEF (Y) ★★1/2. Misfit high-schooler Percy Jackson (Logan Lerman) learns that he is a demigod, goes to an academy for others of his kind and undertakes a quest to rescue his mother (Catherine Keener) and clear himself of the charge of stealing Zeus' lightning bolt. Heavy on the special effects and light on the playful humor that made Rick Riordan's young-adult series such fun. 1 hr. 59 PG (special-effects monsters, action violence, swordfighting).

VALENTINE'S DAY (Y-Ve) ★★ Garry Marshall's all-star candy sampler, manifested in the mold of "Love, Actually" and starring Ashton Kutcher, Jennifer Garner, Jamie Foxx, Anne Hathaway, Taylor Swift and George Lopez as the Angelinos whose romantic destinies converge, diverge and cloverleaf like the LA interstates. 2 hrs. PG-13 (risque language, sexual candor).

THE WOLFMAN (Ve) ★1/2. Benicio Del Toro stars as the werewolf-savaged hero who turns beastly himself in this fog-shrouded Victorian dud. With Anthony Hopkins, seemingly opiated, and Emily Blunt. 1 hr. 42 R (decapitations and entrails, mayhem on the moors, lycanthropic themes).
