

they need to do," Obama said during a pre-Super Bowl interview with NBC. He reiterated that the United States has removed no option from consideration in dealing with Iran — an allusion to military intervention — but emphasized that the United States wants a diplomatic solution built around a world coalition.

Iran insists its nuclear pursuits are for peaceful civilian purposes, not a bomb.

After years of worries about Iran's nuclear program, world leaders are now showing real concern that Israel could attack the Islamic republic imminently — a move that might trigger a broader war and disrupt the international economy.

Iran's regime says it wants to extinguish the Jewish state, and the West accuses it of assembling the material and know-how to build a nuclear bomb. Just last week, Defense Secretary Leon Panetta would not dispute a report that he believes Israel may attack Iran this spring in an attempt to set back the Islamic republic's nuclear program.

Obama refused to say whether the United States would get notice from Israel before any potential strike on Iran.

"I will say that we have closer military and intelligence consultation between our two countries than we've ever had,"

Obama said, adding, "We are going to be sure that we work in lockstep as we proceed to try to solve this — hopefully diplomatically."

The United States is leading that persuasion initiative, even though Washington largely has concluded that outside argument will have little effect on Israeli decision-making.

"Any kind of additional military activity inside the Gulf is disruptive and has a big effect on us," Obama said. "It could have a big effect on oil prices. We've still got troops in Afghanistan, which borders Iran."

As for the danger of retaliation by Iran against the United States, Obama said, "We don't see any evidence that they have those intentions or capabilities right now."

Obama said Israel is feeling the pinch of sanctions but Israel is rightfully worried about its security.

On the economy, Obama was pressed about a prediction he made three years ago on Super Bowl Sunday: "If I don't have this done in three years, then there's gonna be a one-term proposition." Republican leaders, including Mitt Romney, the frontrunner for the GOP presidential nomination, have seized on that remark as millions of people are still hurting economically.

Obama said Sunday, "I deserve a second term, but we're not done."

He said the direction of the economy has turned around significantly since three years ago, pointing to a new job report last week that showed a surge in hiring.

75 YEARS AGO

Saturday, February 6, 1937

- S. G. Donaldson, disaster relief chairman of the Yankton county chapter of the American Red Cross, reported \$1,484.15 was sent from the county for relief of flood sufferers.
- The Yankton high school building was broken into last night and locks forced off lockers in the domestic science department and some food stuffs taken, according to reports of the police department, which was notified by the school authorities last night after the entry was discovered.

50 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, February 6, 1962

- Yankton had one of the lowest overall mill levies among the 25 largest cities in South Dakota in 1961, with only three cities listed having lower mill levy totals, according to figures prepared by the State Department of Revenue, Pierre.
- State Forester Robert Arkins today issued a reminder urging farmers and ranchers to place orders now for trees which they are going to want to plant this spring. Approximately two million trees will be offered to farmers and ranchers throughout South Dakota on a "cost basis" by the Dept. of Game, Fish and Parks.

25 YEARS AGO

Friday, February 6, 1987

- The burden of serving in the military has been distributed unfairly, according to Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., who has introduced a bill to reinstate the draft. Hollings and other critics of the all-volunteer force say the draft is likely to be needed in the next decade because the pool of young persons is decreasing.
- Seven Republicans have

introduced a bill calling for a 2-cent increase in the state's fuel tax. If passed, the tax would rise up to 15 cents a gallon. Rep. Walt Zabel, R-Selby, said, "A 2- or 3-cent increase in the tax now won't even be noticed across the state. Nobody can convince me that 2 cents more is going to cause a furor."
