that the fire would get in the space between the original ceiling and the renovated ceiling.

"We were lucky that we got it fast enough that it never got a chance to spread in that space," Nickles said. "It was a good save, and the guys did a heck of a job."

Fred Donaldson built what is now the Black Steer in the late 1800s for a store that housed groceries, a bakery, a meat department and a slaughterhouse. The Fred Donaldson Co. was a popular retail business in Yankton for almost 50 years. It was eventually bought by Ted and Victoria Vlahakis, and remodeled into the restaurant.

ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Wednesday, February 10, 1937

- Some idea of what the county highway department and its employees have to go through during periods of blizzards and blockaded highways came to light when it became necessary to find some means of getting Julius Ness, aged farmer, to town after he had fallen out of a second story window at 4 o'clock Monday morning and needed medical attention and hospitalization. All roads were blocked tight. At the time it was blowing hard and snow was drifting about as fast as it could be plowed out.
- Emergency conditions justifying use of WPA workers for snow removal were declared in seven South Dakota counties today, following word received by Governor Jensen that only under this procedure could the Works Progress Administration provide assistance.

50 YEARS AGO

Saturday, February 10, 1962

- The Yankton Bucks staged two comebacks in an ESD contest on the Senior High court last night, but the one that counted fell short and they went down 54 to 50 before the Brookings Bobcats. After holding a four-point half-time lead, the Bucks faltered in the late second half, then came back to life, but not in time to upset the visitors.
- Gary Smith was once again the main cog for the Scotland Highlanders as they beat the Avon Pirates here last night, 56 to 47. It was a LMVC game and left the Highlanders in first place with one game to go.

25 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, February 10, 1987

- The Yankton School District's \$75,000 offer on Crane-Youngworth field could mean a continuation of Friday nights filled with cheers and glory once heard by Yankton College football teams, regardless of the college's future. The board officially made the offer on the football field at its Monday meeting after several years of leasing the facility, including the last two seasons since Yankton College closed in 1984.
- Two additional elementary principals will be added to the list of administrators for the Yankton School District in the 1987-88 school year. The Yankton School Board voted 4-1, with Board President Ron Bertsch voting no, to advertise for the two administrative positions.
