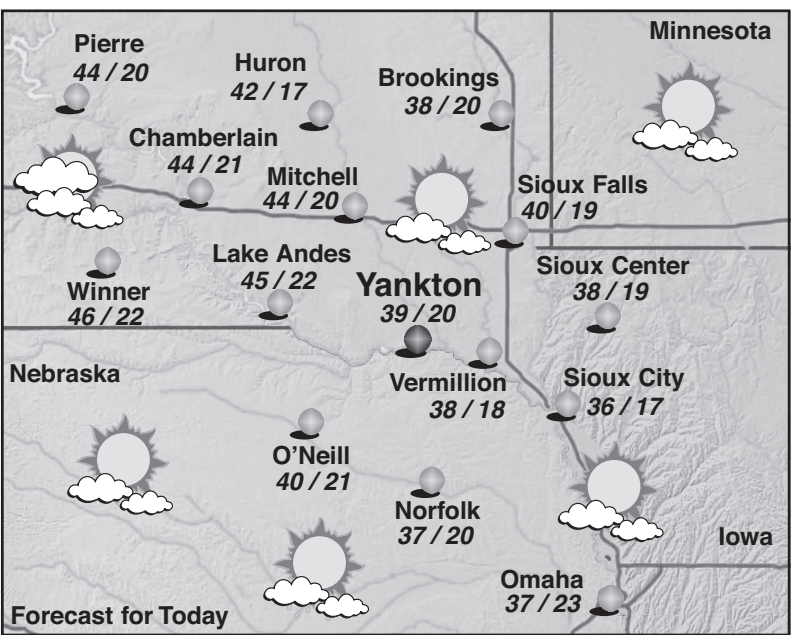

Man Is Sentenced In Cedar County Incest Case

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A 38-year-old man convicted of sexual assault and incest in northeast Nebraska's Cedar County has been sentenced to 25 years in prison on each of sexual assault charges and 5 to 10 years on each of the incest charges. The sentences are to be served concurrently. The man was accused of sexually assaulting a child over a 10-year period beginning when the child was 6-years-old. The case stemmed from an investigation involving authorities in Nebraska and Sioux City, Iowa. The Nebraska attorney general's office says the man was sentenced on Monday to 25 to 30

In refinancing the bonds, the district also was informed that their Standard & Poors investment grade was increased from A to AA/Stable, an increase of three notches from when the bonds were originally issued. "That the rating did increase was great news for the district," she said. "It just goes to show that we do have a very financially sound district here." Greeneway said that board members have been visiting with the community in advance of the upcoming opt-out vote. Because of the issues raised about the

district's health care plan, the board choose to hear a report Monday night on consumer-directed healthcare options during the meeting. "We, at this point, have heard some concerns about our health care plan," she said. "We know we have a good plan, but to be prudent and fiscally responsible for our district, we decided to listen to some other options that are out there. I think it was indicated that our current plan started several years ago and since it has done well for us, it really hasn't been looked at. This is our opportunity to make sure that what we have is as good as we can (get) for the district." Other business during the meeting Monday included the board setting the polling places and appointing the elections

workers for the Feb. 28 vote. Polling places will be: Precinct 1 — City Hall; Precinct 2 and 28 — The Center; Precinct 3 — Yankton Middle School; Precinct 4 and 26 — Lincoln Elementary School; Precinct 5 — Yankton Mall; Precinct 11 — Vangen Fellowship Hall; Precinct 12 — Utica Lumber Yard; Absentee voting — the administration building of the Yankton School District or the Yankton County Government Center. Following the meeting, Gree-

neway stated that the board has not been fielding a lot of questions about the opt-out. "We have been out there visiting with organizations that want us to come and speak," she said. "We haven't been hearing a lot of questions, but that may change as we get closer to the time to vote. "I think what we want to tell the patrons of the district is, we really did listen to them the first time and tried to carve out a plan that would be acceptable for people to support. I hope that is exactly what is going on."
