CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for March delivery fell 11 cents to \$6.33 a bushel; March corn fell 12.25 cents to \$6.2950 a bushel; March oats fell 3.25 cents to \$3.2050 a bushel; while March soybeans rose 3.50 cents to \$12.71 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. April live cattle rose 0.22 cent to \$1.3112 a pound; March feeder cattle rose 0.18 cent to \$1.5860 a pound; while April lean hogs fell 0.55 cent to 89.82 cents a pound.

**75 YEARS AGO**  
**Monday, February 22, 1937**  
• The grain elevator of the Riley-Arneson Grain & Coal Co., was burned Saturday afternoon together with between 12,000 and 13,000 bushels of grain, mostly oats, in the worst fire that has occurred in Yankton in a considerable time. The loss is unestimated at this time but an adjuster is here, arriving last night. Just what the origin of the fire was not known but there is some indication that it may have been from an electrical short.  
• Elated and encouraged by their 33-24 victory over the highly-regarded Huron Scalpers which was made possible by a brilliant scoring drive in the last four minutes of play Saturday night at the high school auditorium, the Yankton college Greyhounds travel to Sioux Falls this evening confident that they can make the going rough for the Augustana Vikings, co-leaders of the South Dakota intercollegiate conference with Dakota Wesleyan.  
**50 YEARS AGO**  
**Thursday, February 22, 1962**  
• To tell the truth on George Washington's birthday, the forecast of additional snow, bitter cold and strong winds leading up to blizzard conditions was not met with any enthusiasm in Yankton today. The blizzard warning from the weather bureau indicated it would be mostly cloudy with scattered snows today, tonight and Friday. It will turn colder late this afternoon, with snow accompanied by northerly winds, much blowing and drifting snow and sharply falling temperatures "causing blizzard or near blizzard conditions tonight."  
• A local sportsman, Lawrence Kaiser has recently discovered that he has two whitetail deer "racks" (antlers), which are large enough to enter the Boone and Crockett Club, an organization which keeps records on North American big game heads which score higher than a certain minimum score, the minimum varying with the species. The larger of the two heads scores 169 and 3/8ths, while the smaller head scores 164.
