



Fedders, Cornemann Power Gazelles Past Huron 66-48

Yankton Clinches Second In ESD, District 2AA

HURON — Emily Fedders and Chloe Cornemann ensured that the Yankton Gazelles did not suffer a hiccup in their final regular season action.

The senior tandem combined for 44 points, with eight three-pointers, as the Gazelles won for the seventh straight game, 66-48 in Huron on Tuesday night.

With the win, Yankton (14-5) not only solidified a home game in the first round of district play but clinched second place outright in the Eastern South Dakota Conference (ESD).

“You always worry about these kind of games, but we told the girls, ‘We still have things to play for,’” coach Doug Pesicka said. “We were playing to host in the districts and to get second place in the ESD.

“To our girls,” Pesicka said, “we want to thank them.”

Fedders scored a game-high 23 points on 5-of-8 shooting from three-point range and Cornemann drilled three 3's on the way to 21 points.

Pesicka said later he doesn't believe he has ever had two players score at least 20 points in the same game.

The Gazelles jumped ahead early and cruised to a 40-25 halftime lead, spurred by that outside shooting. Yankton shot 67 percent in the first half, including 6-of-10 on threes.

“We were able to get the ball inside early, and that forced them to collapse the outside,” Pesicka said. “It's one thing to get the shots, but you have to

make them.”

Junior Mikala Hora added 10 rebounds for Yankton, which out-rebounded Huron 35-15. Junior Kelsey Fitzgerald added eight points and four rebounds in the win.

In the loss for the Tigers (2-18), Chrystal Merriam scored 12 points and Taylor Roterd added 11 points.

The victory for Yankton ensures that the Gazelles will host defending champion Brandon Valley in the first round of the District 2AA Tournament next Monday night.

“You don't want to limp into the playoffs,” Pesicka said. “We wanted to keep the momentum going. We've made a nice run here lately, but our goals are set much higher.”

In the only sub-varsity game, Yankton won the sophomore contest 41-34 behind 14 points and seven rebounds from Andi Sprakel. Anna Gulick added 12 points and Madison Dangler grabbed five rebounds for the Gazelles, who finish the season 1-13.

Wolter Earns Second Summit League Athlete of Week Honor

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota senior Kenna Wolter has been named the Summit League Athlete of the Week in track and field, the league announced on Monday. The honor is the second for Wolter during the indoor season.

Wolter (Santa Maria, Calif.) continued her outstanding season in the triple jump, setting a personal record of 41-5.34 during the John Dalton Invitational in Vermillion on Feb. 17. It is the third consecutive week that Wolter has set a school record in the event. The 41-5.34 is the top mark in the Summit League this season and the ranked 25th nationally.

Wolter earned her first honor on Feb. 7, and it is the third time that a Coyote student-athlete has received the weekly award this season. Freshman Emily Grohe (Pontiac, Ill.) also earned the honor earlier this year.

The Coyote track and field teams will compete at the Summit League Indoor Championships starting Friday in Fort Wayne, Ind.

Boss Named Summit League Co-Player of The Week

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota senior Jodie Boss has been named the Summit League Co-Player of the Week in women's basketball, the league announced on Tuesday. It is the first weekly honor for Boss, who shares the weekly honor with Kerah Nelson of UIUJ.

Boss (Columbus, Neb.) received the honor after averaging 8.0

points, 7.5 blocks, 11.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game last week. She recorded one of the best shooting weeks in school history, finishing with 15 blocks in two games, including a single-game school record of nine against UIUJ on Feb. 18. Those nine blocks were part of a single-game team record of 16 set by the Coyotes. Two nights later at Western Illinois, Boss finished with six blocks, giving her 110 blocks for the season, a new single-season school record. Boss finished the game with 10 points, 13 rebounds (tying a career-high) and six blocks. It was her fourth double-double of the season.

For the year, Boss is averaging 7.3 points, 7.3 rebounds and 4.2 blocks per contest. Her 4.2 blocks per contest is second in the nation.

The Coyotes (19-7, 10-6 Summit League) are back in action Saturday at home against Oakland. Game time is 5 p.m. at the Dakota-Dome in Vermillion.
