SIOUX CITY, Iowa — You had to feel bad for GPAC as her team came up six points short on Wednesday night. One of two seniors on the Mount Marty College women's basketball team, Gross was the perfect epitome of how the Lancers have progressed during her career.

Not necessarily the most gifted post player in program history, Gross developed to the point where she was a legitimate scorer and a rebounding machine. She finished her senior season with 15 double-doubles — twice the number of the Mount Marty men.

Sure, there were some brief tears after Wednesday's GPAC Tournament loss at Morningside, even following

a tough loss, Gross was quick to point out the good for her team.

Saying that she believes the Lancers can learn from the 83-77 defeat and can return next season as a force in the GPAC, Gross was the essence moving on from her own career.

It's true, the Lancers return all but two players from a team that went 15-15 this season. Kaylea Karst is the only other senior on the roster.

Look at what Mount Marty will be able to trot out there in 2012-13 — Taylor Forsch, Alexa Berg, Hannah Youngberg, April Winne, Allison De Kam, Johanna Scheich, Tara DesLauriers, Brittany Little and Holly Hegge (not to mention a few others).

## USD Track & Field Signs Three More Recruits

VERMILLION — South Dakota track and field coaches Dave Gottsleben and Lucky Huber have announced the signing of three more student-athletes for the 2012-13 season. Joining the Coyote program in 2012-13 will be Isaac Allen of Lincoln, Neb., Meghan Dennis of Gretna, Neb., and Christian Nielsen of Lincoln.

"The addition of these three student-athletes helps further solidify our 2012-13 recruiting class," Huber said. "We still are hoping to add one or two more athletes to finish out the class."

Allen, from Lincoln East HS, won the 2011 Nebraska Class A state cross country title, which was seventh-best on the All-Class A medalist list. He was a gold medalist in the 4 x 800 relay and finished 12th in the steeplechase at the Young Men's Nationals 2011 USATF Silver Medalist in the 2,000-meter steeplechase.

Dennis, from Gretna HS, holds the school record in the shot put (39-11.5) and owns a career best discus throw of 139-11.

Nielsen, from Madison, was the Class A champion in the 400 meters (49.03) and was the state runner-up in the 200 meters. He also anchored the state runner-up 4 x 100 relay.

### Calif. Libero Signs With MMC

Rosie Esparza, a 5-4 libero from Lindsay, Calif., will attend Mount Marty and play volleyball for the Lancers beginning this fall, the institution announced on Wednesday.

Esparza averaged 35 digs per match this past season, earning sec-

ond-team all-East Sequoia League honors. She also was named the team's Most Valuable Player of the Year, as well as all-tournament in the Strathmore (Calif.) Tournament.

"Rosie is making a big move by coming all the way from California — it shows how very dedicated to the sport she is," said MMC head coach Candice Climer. "She has played some tough competition on the West Coast so we are excited to have her join our Lancers team and for her to bring that competitive attitude with her."

Esparza's high school coach, Amy Pohl, also had high praise of the libero.

"I believe that Rosie will commit her heart to becoming a defensive standout and show unselfish loyalty to Mount Marty and their community, just as she has done here," she said. "Mount Marty was a very important choice for Rosie as her faith leads her career choices and accomplishments on the court. MMC is almost 1700 miles away from her home, and for the first time she will be away from her twin sister. Rosie will be an inspiration for many Lindsay High School Cardinal athletes and we are very proud of her."

Esparza, daughter of Simona Esparza, plans to major in Criminal Justice at Mount Marty College. She will receive an Academic Incentive Scholarship along with her volleyball award.

# Pastrana Recovers While He Awaits NASCAR Debut

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Travis Pastrana arrived for NASCAR's annual media day last week and has been hanging around ever since.

And he hasn't even gotten into a race car.

Pastrana watched the exhibition Budweiser Shootout from the grandstands, stuck around for Daytona 500 qualifying and even spent two off days living it up in this ocean-side city. Why? Well, the 28-year-old extreme sports star is trying to soak in as much NASCAR as possible before making his much-anticipated debut in April.

Pastrana is scheduled to drive seven races in the Nationwide Series this season, beginning with the April 27 event at Richmond International Raceway. His debut will come nine months after Pastrana originally planned to join NASCAR's second-tier series — a move derailed when he shattered his right foot and ankle in a motorcycle crash at the X-Games.

"No words can really describe the disappointment," Pastrana said last week. "I felt like I let everyone down."

It certainly was a setback for NASCAR and its television partners. They openly laud Pastrana as one of auto racing's rising stars, mentioning him in the same breath as former IndyCar driver Danica Patrick, defending Daytona 500 winner Trevor Bayne and defending Indianapolis Series champion Ricky Stenhouse Jr.

They point to his engaging personality, his ability to drive anything on wheels and his strong following among the much-sought-after younger generation. Throw in his boundless confidence — Pastrana has a picture of himself driving a monster truck and crushing the No. 48 car of five-time NASCAR champion Jimmie Johnson on his firesuit — and he would seem to be one of the most marketable drivers in the garage.

Pastrana welcomes any and all attention.

It's hardly anything new, either.

Two years ago, on New Year's Eve, Pastrana set a world record by jumping his rally car 269 feet off a California pier onto a floating barge anchored in Long Beach's Rainbow Harbor.

In 2007, he jumped out of an airplane without a parachute over Arecibo, Puerto Rico, and met up with another jumper in midair before finishing with a side tandem landing.

He also has been an X-Games medalist, placed monster trucks, competed in motocross, supercross, the 24-hour race at Daytona, several international events and starred in an extreme-stunt series called "Nitro Circus." The series has a movie version due out this summer.

"Anybody who is that interesting and brings such a new audience to the racing community has the potential to grow his brand, grow interest in the sport on an unlimited basis as long as he gets it done on the racetrack," said Rich Feinberg, ESPN's vice president of motorsports production. "He's easy to cover."

"All the things that he has touched he has been very successful at. I'm not somebody who looks at him and has a big question mark. He's going to do quite well."

Pastrana's NASCAR venture was supposed to start last summer.

But he crashed during a "best truck" event in the X-Games on July 28, breaking his foot in 40 places after failing to safely land his motorcycle following a flip and spin combination.

Pastrana, who had won medals at every X-Games since 2002, planned to compete in two X-Games events Thursday and Friday, fly to Indianapolis to make his Nationwide debut Saturday and then return to Los Angeles to compete in RallyCross on Sunday. ESPN producers were so enthralled they dubbed it "Pastrana-thon."

Instead, Pastrana ended up in bed for a month and out of commission considerably longer.

"We were disappointed," Fein-
