Gavins Point releases averaged 14,800 cfs during the month of January. Releases were temporarily increased to 16,000 cfs in early February due to an ice jam on the Missouri River above Sioux City. No flooding resulted during the jam. The ice jam caused a temporary reduction in flows downstream of the jam, which resulted in a drop in

The reservoir behind Gavins Point Dam ended January at an elevation of 1,207.3 feet above mean sea level (msl). The reservoir will gradually be lowered to elevation 1.206 by the end of February to make room for potential spring


