Distance Runners Pace USD At

ISU Classic

AMES, Iowa — Brant Haase and Ashley Sveum both recorded third-place finishes in non-seeded events to lead the South Dakota track and field teams at the Iowa State Classic on Friday.

Haase placed third in the non-seeded 5,000-meters in 14:45.19, which is the Summit League's third fastest time in the event. Isaac Allen placed ninth in the same event in 15:04.49, which is the seventh best league time.

Ethan Marquardt added a top-five finish for USD with a fourth in the non-seeded 3,000-meters in 8:26.34 (third best in league). USD's men's and women's distance runners combined for 12 season-bests for the day.

In men's sprinting events, Michael Burrus qualified for the 60-meter finals on Saturday after finishing seventh in

the preliminaries (6.93) and Christian Nielsen placed fifth in the non-seeded 200-meters (21.92).

In women's races, Sveum placed third in the non-seeded 400-meters in 56.79, which is the fourth-fastest league mark this season. Tess Johnson also had a top-five finish with a fourth in the non-seeded 600-yard run (1:26.20).

Amber Eichkom set the league's third-fastest time in the non-seeded 5,000-meters in 17:45.16, with Megan Hilson (Yankton, 17:47.35) and Ali Gress (17:47.92) setting the fourth and fifth-best league times, respectively. In the non-seeded 3,000-meters, Katie Wetzstein recorded the fifth-fastest league time with a 10:04.93 finish.

For South Dakota State, Parkston native Luke Leischner finished the 200-meter dash with a time of 22.13 seconds. Krista Creager (Yankton) clocked in at 2:15.77 during the 800-meter run.

The Iowa State Classic will continue today (Saturday) with seeded competition starting at 11 a.m.

USD Softball Opens Season With

Two Losses In Utah

ST. GEORGE, Utah — South Dakota women's softball lost both its games on the first day of play at the Red Desert Classic, falling 4-3 (8 inn.) to Utah Valley and 8-4 to Utah at the Canyons Complex.

In the season opener against the Utah Valley Wolver-

ines (1-0), South Dakota entered the top of the seventh inning trailing 3-0 but rallied to tie the score at 3-3. After a leadoff single by Kassie Loe, Christine Broders doubled and Kate Snow followed with a single to bring Loe home for the Coyotes' first RBI of the year.

Two outs and one RBI later, Allie Daly came to the plate with runners on first and third and two outs. Daly delivered a game-tying single into left field, but UVU pitcher Josi Summers got the next batter to fly out to end the inning.

Katelyn Wudel started the eighth inning of play at second base per the international rule tie-breaker, but after a Matley Jones walk, Summers' retired three straight batters on a foul-ball pop fly, a groundout and a strikeout.

Krystin Jachim delivered the game-winning single with one out in the bottom of the eighth, scoring pinch-runner Kelli Fox from second base.

Denney went the distance in game one, striking out three and only surrendering two earned runs on nine hits and one walk.

UVU's Dara Kossanke was 3-3 while Debra Lovell, Jachim and Dynasty Lauvai each drove in one run.

In the second game of the day the Utah Utes started fast with a five-run first inning with the aid of four walks, an error and a wild pitch.

Utah's Kelsi Hoopiaina led off the second inning with a solo home run to push the Utes lead to 6-0. Frain settled down after that, retiring seven of the next nine batters she faced. She allowed four earned runs, six hits, walked seven and struck out seven in her complete game effort.

South Dakota scored four runs in the bottom of the third to cut the lead to 6-4. Boyd and Daly each delivered RBI singles.

Utah capped on a run in the fourth and another in the sixth inning.

Dinning, who led the 'Yotes with 50 hits last season, went 4 for 8 with a double and a run scored on the day, while Daly had three hits including a double and three RBIs. Broders, Loe and Boyd each had two hits and a run scored. Loe also had two RBIs.

The Coyotes will continue play in the Red Desert Classic today (Saturday) at noon (CT) against Tennessee. USD will play Idaho State (noon) and Utah State (2:30) on Sunday, the final day of the tournament.

Rachel Kranda and Miranda Vlach-Buller finished fourth and eight, respectively, in the 500 freestyle. Kranda swam a personal-best (5:21.07) while Vlach-Buller set a

new season-best (5:31.80). Stacie Kjeldsen took ninth in the event (5:33.61) while McKenzie Shroyer finished 10th (5:37.22).
