ment will be able to track who sponsored the various items throughout the city, Larson added.

The Type A and B sponsorships received unanimous approval.

Secondly, the commission reviewed a newly-written comprehensive policy for Type C and Type D sponsorship/naming rights.

Type C would apply to events such as a golf tournament or summer band concert series.

"Sponsoring an event is a very short-term thing," Larson said. "The example would be Fourth of July fireworks. If we are going to expand that event and have sponsorships sought to pay for entertainment or fireworks or whatever the case may be, we may go out and look for one or two sponsors for that festival."

The sponsor would be allowed to put up signs and promote the event as it approaches.

"But when that event ends on July 4, the signs come down and the naming rights/sponsorship deal is done," Larson explained.

The sponsorship cost will be based on a percentage of estimated costs to be determined event by event by the standing committee for naming rights.

the next superintendent will ultimately be entirely up to the school board, and the interview committees and the consulting group play only an advisory role in the search.

"The earlier time frame the board is looking at gives us some time to figure out interview schedules," Melmer said. "The time table we're looking at should put YSD in a favorable position to get quality applicants."

Board members are targeting April 11 for in-person interviews.

Also Monday night, the school board spoke about next year's budget.

Jason Bietz, YSD business manager, said the district has been holding the line on expenses in recent years, including keeping the same supplies and materials budget over the past several years, and also have frozen pay increases for teachers and administrators for the past few years.

For next year's budget, Bietz projects a shortfall of around \$1.6 million, as of today.

"The projected budget does not take into account any one-time monies the state might give us," he said. "It only considers ongoing revenue sources for the budget."

The district recently utilized its healthcare reserves in order to avoid making drastic cuts to student programs.

"The health insurance we have is a significant expense to the district," Bietz said.

Board members might consider utilizing healthcare reserves again, using capital outlay flexibility or unemployment reserves.

"The Affordable Care Act will have a big impact on the district going forward," Bietz said. "Sixty-three employees will be added to the healthcare plan from us, having to cover employees who work 30 or more hours a week, versus the 35 or more hours a week we previously covered. We have to comply with the law or we will face significant fines."

Also Monday night board members:

- accepted the bid from Jonhston Painting of Wakonda to paint Beadle School this summer;
- approved the bid from APS Sports Floors, Inc., for sanding, painting and refinishing the gym floors at Yankton High School/Summit Activities Center this summer;
- approved the bid from Floor To Ceiling of Yankton for carpet repair and replacement at Beadle School;
- approved the bid from Roy Johnston Roofing Co. of Yankton for roof repair and resealing at Lincoln and Webster schools;
- approved a five-year service contract with SDN Communications for high-speed point-to-point fiber connectivity between school buildings in accordance with Erate requirements
- approved an orchestra trip to Marty Indian School and Wagner schools.

by an industry like farming, where technology makes it possible to do more with less people.

"With South Dakota's economy focused in large part on agriculture, part of the de-population of the more rural counties and areas will probably continue for a while," he stated.

While South Dakota's population overall increased by about 59,000 in the 2010 Census, 91 percent of the growth occurred in Lincoln, Minnehaha and Pennington counties. Half of South Dakota's population lives in six counties, Goss added.

Increasingly, South Dakota's median age will get older in future decades, meaning industries like health care will thrive, he said.

YAPG President Mike Dellinger acknowledged the adage that, "If you're not growing, you're declining."

"I think that was evident in today's presentation," he said. "We have to work smarter and be more successful at what we are doing as a community to make it more attractive to those who are looking at it and coming here or going somewhere else. What can we do to become more competitive and aggressive as a community to at-

tract new talent? Also, what are we doing to raise the skill levels of our existing workforce to bring people up?"

YAPG attempted to answer that challenge Monday with a list of its activities and goals for the future. During his address, Dellinger noted:

- Plans are currently under way to build a new industrial spec building on the east side of Yankton to attract more primary jobs;
- YAPG recently agreed to assist Yankton Wireless, a local startup that will provide wireless broadband capacities to Yankton County. While individual users will be able to subscribe to broadband, part of the agreement with YAPG is that Yankton Wireless will provide free service to the state campgrounds at Lewis and Clark Lake, as well as various local government entities;
- A housing study will be undertaken to determine if the market is adequate for Yankton's future; and
- Dataware Green, the data storage company along West City Limits Road that was assisted by YAPG, is expected to expand this year.

"2013 will be a busy year," Dellinger promised.

That committee would consist of city commissioners, city staff and applicable city department advisory board members.

Type D applies to naming rights for buildings or rooms inside of buildings that are being built or remodeled.

"When we originally wrote this policy, we were thinking just parks and recreation," Larson said. "As we took comments, everybody thought it would be good to cover the entire city."

The current recommendation written into the policy is that to attain the naming rights for a structure, a private party would have to supply funds that are equal to or greater than 75 percent of the total costs.

"If we're building an aquatic center and it's going to cost \$10 million, we're saying somebody needs to give \$7.5 million for naming rights," Larson said. "Maybe that's too great of a number. Maybe it needs to be smaller."

The standing committee for naming rights would still be able to recommend that the City Commission grant naming rights for less than 75 percent if it wanted, however.

"We set it up to have some wiggle room," Larson said.

A termination date for the naming rights will be written into the agreements on a case-by-case basis.

"That way, as the facility ages and you need to make upgrades, you have

the ability to get future sponsorships to help pay for that," Larson stated.

The commission decided that if there are going to be cases in which the city is willing to accept less than 75 percent for naming rights, it should be stated more concretely in the written policy. Commissioners unanimously chose to table the Type C and D sponsorships/naming rights policy until the language is finalized.

Finally, the commission unanimously approved a policy for granting naming rights when there is no financial contribution involved. This would be the case if the commission wants to name a building or room after a historic figure or an outstanding individual.

In other business Monday, the commission received a report from Environmental Services Director Kyle Goodman on water treatment system upgrades.

He said bid documents are being completed for a collector well study at Paddle Wheel Point and HDR, Inc., is finalizing a design plan for Water Treatment Plant No. 2 improvements. Additionally, staff are drafting a possible water conservation ordinance that could be put into effect when water usage is high.

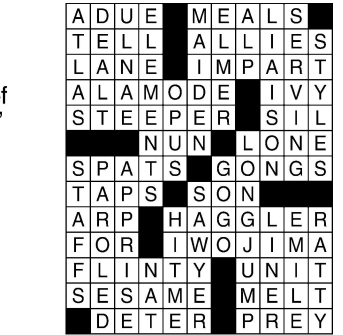

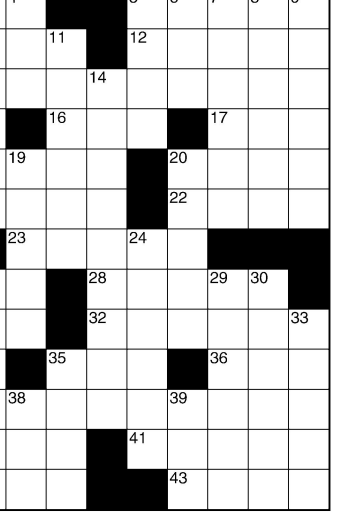
