VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota Coyotes followed a recipe for home success on Saturday afternoon that had served them so well this season, using a strong second-half push fueled by rebounding and a suffocating defense to claim their regular season home finale over Western Illinois by a final of 71-67.

The win, which gives the Coyotes a home record of 9-4, moves USD back to 500 (14-14) and solidifies their thirdplace Summit League women's basketball standing (9-6) with one regular season contest left to play.

After taking a 31-29 halftime lead, the

Coyotes fell behind Western Illinois by seven points with just under 10 minutes to play, but USD outscored the Leathernecks 24-13 over the final 8:38 of action to escape with the win.

'As a team down the stretch we came together and did what we were supposed to do," Coyote senior Tempestt Wilson said. "This game was really big for us, we needed this win.


DeHaven said that overall the first day went mostly as planned, with a few competitors making today's (Monday) event finals that were not anticipated.
