Vikings' New Stadium Will Host Baseball

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The Minnesota Vikings' new football stadium will be designed to accommodate a baseball field. The Vikings and the Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority announced agreement Friday on a multi-use field configuration for the \$975 million stadium. The Minnesota Twins left the Metrodome for their own new ballpark at Target Field in 2010. But the Minnesota Gophers and other college and prep baseball teams want to play early-season games in the Vikings' new stadium. Under the agreement, the new stadium will feature a 26-foot-high right field wall, retractable seats on the north sideline and removable dugouts.

Coyotes

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closed strong to finish third after being fourth — and at one time, fifth — for most of Monday. North Dakota State won its sixth straight indoor crown with 186 points, and was followed by newcomer Omaha (118) and the Coyotes (114).

Though the Coyote women had only two individual champions on Monday, each was rather significant.

Junior Bethany Buell set a Dakota-Dome and conference record in the pole vault with a winning jump of 14-feet-5 1/2 and junior transfer Megan Glisar did the same in winning the high jump at 5-feet-11 1/4. Amber Eichkorn was named Women's Newcomer of the Championship.

Buell's mark also moved her to fourth in Division I in the pole vault, nearing her ultimate goal of top three at the national indoor meet.

"Relief was the main emotion I had," she said. "I've been waiting this whole season to PR (personal record) again, so to have it come together at the conference meet is awesome."

Glisar, a transfer from Morningside College, fell short in attempts to break the dome record of 6-feet, but still broke the Summit League record.

"There's a lot of great jumpers in the league, and it could've been anyone's day," she said. "I would've loved to get that next height and qualify for nationals, but there's still one more meet left."

As far as this meet in particular, it was especially sweet given that it was the first for USD since the school left the Great West Conference, Gottsleben said.

"I hope this breaks that barrier for every sport," he said. "We have great coaches and great administrative support, so hopefully gives all of us confidence that they can do it too."

added. "We knew we weren't going to score a ton of points — but we exceeded that by about 10 so that was good to see."

DeHaven did get excited by the fact that his team was made up of almost entirely underclassmen.

"We had so many young guys that scored for us," he said. "Several freshman scored and hopefully that translates to us putting a strong team together down the road."

Sophomore Trent Lusignan led the Jackrabbits on the second day with a victory in the 5000 meter run. Lusignan, who finished second to USD's Jeff Mettler in the 3000 meter run on Sunday, used an aggressive pace to make sure

that the race would not come down to a kick.

"We had one of our guys take it out in 70 (second quarters) to string it out a bit so we weren't going out in five-minute miles," Lusignan said. "I kind of had to pull away the last mile. I don't have that great of finishing speed."

DeHaven echoed Lusignan's statements of running a strategic race to keep Mettler from using a slow pace to add a 5000 victory to his weekend (he won the 3000 meter run on Sunday night and the mile earlier Monday afternoon).

"We made sure the pace was going to be honest," DeHaven said. "We wanted to run fast and Trent was ready to run and took advantage of the situation."

Another standout performance for the Jackrabbit men was freshman LeAndre Kennedy's third-place finish in the 60 meter dash with a clocking of 6.93.

Bison senior Travis Fitzke, a former

Pierre standout, racked up a number of points for the NDSU men, finishing runner-up in the mile and 5000 meter run.

A number of Summit League and DakotaDome records fell throughout the weekend, including the conference mark for the high jump. Jamario Taylor of Western Illinois eclipsed the old meet record with a leap of 7-1.50.

"Throughout the season I was consistently around seven feet," Taylor said. "My coach said conference is the time to step up big and the atmosphere here got me pumped up."

Most of this weekend's competitors see their indoor season come to an end with the Summit League Championships, except for a select few who will compete on March 8-9 at the NCAA Division I Indoor Championships in Fayetteville, Ark.
