"I think, in the back of my mind, I knew that if I wanted to do something for the community, I could do more by doing that job than anything else," he stated. "I think, subconsciously, that is part of the reason I kept doing

According to current City Attorney David Hosmer, Goetz sacrificed a lot during his years serving Yankton. Hosmer took over the position from Goetz and also served as a city commissioner for six years while Goetz was legal counsel.

"As city attorney, he could not represent persons charged with crimes when a city officer was involved," Hosmer said of Goetz' private practice. "Additionally, Jim filed suits for the city and never billed for them. He also took a very small wage for all of his services. He told me it was his way of giving back to the community.

During Monday's City Com-

mission meeting, a moment of silence was held for Goetz.

"We definitely appreciate his service to Yankton for so many years," Mayor Nancy Wenande stated.

Commissioner Charlie Gross, who has been on the board for 18 years, said the history that Goetz brought to the commission, as well as his legal acumen, was invaluable.

"Commissions did not have to 'reinvent the wheel,' as Jim had experienced similar issues over the many years he served the Board of Commissioners," Gross said. "He was a steady hand if a commission tried to strike out in a different direction, occasionally reminding us of the board's responsibilities. I also appreciated that he was available each meeting to advise us, which meant that the board did not usually have to wait for the next meeting for an opinion.'

Goetz said in 2009 that he had noticed something in his years practicing law.

"It's a moving world, but many times there are the same basic questions," he stated. "They just have a different twist."

One of the final pieces of life advice Goetz offered the Press & Dakotan in 2009 is something we would probably all do well to remember: "Common sense will
