In what is now referred to as the South Dakota Showdown Series, home teams have ruled the Division I matchups between the USD and SDSU men's basketball teams. The Coyotes win at the DakotaDome and the Jackrabbits win at

Frost Arena. Does that change today (Saturday) when they square off at 4

p.m. in Vermillion? The recipe for USD winning the last two meetings at the dome

has been this: Quick start and hang on in the second half. Consider:

• In 2011-12, the Coyotes came out strong, leading 29-8 before ten minutes had elapsed and took a 34-24 lead into halftime. The

Jacks then out-scored the hosts by six in the second half, but fell short by four points, 72-68.

Coyotes Relying On Homecourt Advantage Against Jackrabbits

· Last season, the Coyotes cruised to a 17-point lead at halftime, only to see the Jacks out-score them by 14 in the second half. Again, SDSU came up just short, 74-71.

A full 40-minute game will understandably be key for either side today. The Coyotes haven't fared all that well in close games (they have losses by 5, 8, 1, 2, 4 and 3 points), but the Jacks don't have Nate Wolters to rely on for big plays in the second half — as has been the case in both previous meetings in Vermillion.

While relatively young, this season's version of the Covotes plays with more energy; it's easily visible - SDSU fans will see that. USD's regular rotation features five sophomores, three juniors (including two in their first seasons with the Coyotes), and two sen-

There's just not a lot of experience to rely on.

The Jackrabbits, meanwhile, are significantly more seasoned, with four seniors that have obviously played in a lot of big-time games. Now, you could argue that North Dakota State — which won in Vermillion on Thursday — was probably the most veteran team in the conference and still had struggles with the Coyotes.

This is where energy and atmosphere come into play; those "intangibles" we always talk about. The DakotaDome will again see a big crowd today, and it's been obvious that such an environment has had direct influence on USD's play on the court — this young group of Coyotes are much more emotional.

More than anything else, rivalry aside, the Coyotes need a win more than the Jackrabbits do right now. USD started league play with three wins, but has now dropped three in a row.

Simply put, picking up a victory today for USD is more important than anything involved with beating a rival. At least that's what the Covotes would tell you

Yankton Baseball Hall Of Fame Banquet Feb. 7

The Yankton Baseball Association will hold its third an-nual Hall of Fame banquet and fundraiser on Friday, Feb. 7, in the banquet room at Minerva's.

Inductees include Bob Tereshinski, Hal Anderson and the 1960 Yankton All-Star team, the first team to attend the national Teener baseball tournament in Hershey, Pa.

Tereshinski coached the Yankton Legion team in the early 1980s, then took over the Mount Marty College program and turned the team into the premier college baseball program in South Dakota in the 1990s. Tereshinski, who retired from coaching after the 1999 season, was inducted into the MMC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007.

Anderson was a local pitcher who went on to sign with the New York Yankees in the late 1940s.

The 1960 Yankton team advanced to the Teener World Series, beating a Williston, N.D., team led by former NBA playing and coaching great Phil Jackson, in the district final. Six of the 15 members of that team still live in Yankton.
