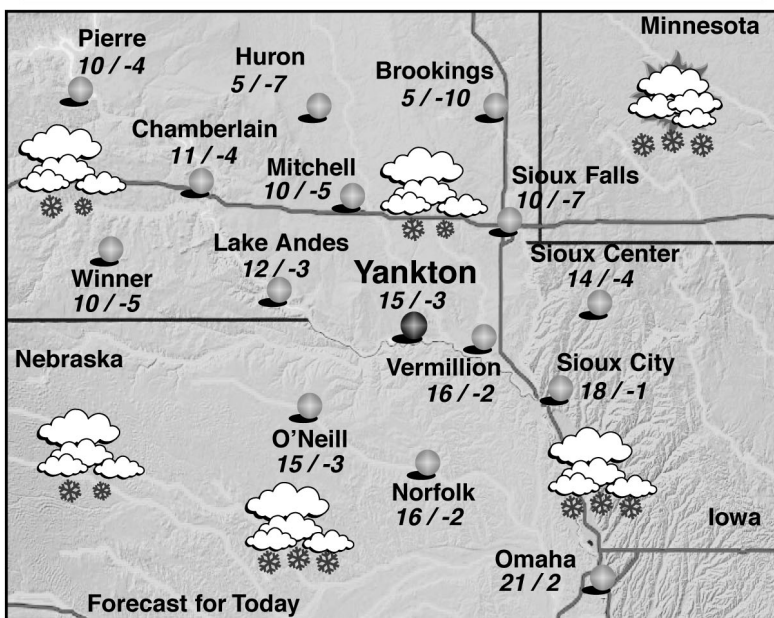

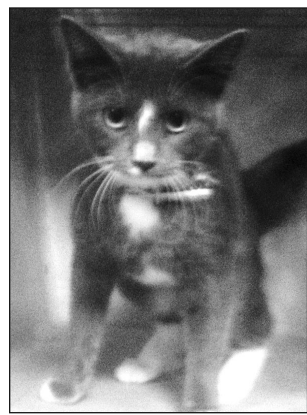

Sign-Up Deadline For Health Marketplace Feb. 15

LAKE ANDES — Since Oct. 1 last year, more than 6 million people have enrolled in new coverage under the health care law. They've signed up either for private insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace or for the Medicaid program. There's still time for you to enroll and have coverage as soon as March 1. All you have to do is sign up with the Health Insurance Marketplace by Feb. 15.
 The Health Insurance Marketplace helps people who need health coverage to find it. When you fill out the Marketplace application, you'll find out if you qualify for a private health insurance plan and whether you qualify for lower costs based on your household size and income. Some people may qualify for the Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Programs in their state. Even if you don't qualify for lower costs, you can still use the Marketplace to buy insurance.
 There are three ways for you to get covered. You can enroll online (HealthCare.gov), over the phone (800-318-2596)

or in-person assistance with Lizzy Bolander, Navigator, 605-487-7634 or 605-469-5363. You'll have the opportunity to compare private plans side-by-side and choose the one that fits your family and budget.
 There are four steps you can take to be sure you're ready for your coverage to begin:
 1. Pay your premium to your health insurance plan by the due date.
 2. Carefully review your member card and other materials your plan sends you.
 3. Review your plan's provider directory so you'll know where you can go for care.
 4. Contact your plan with any questions or if you don't get a member card and enrollment materials.
 And remember, if you enroll by Feb. 15, your coverage will begin as soon as March 1. If you need a little more time, the open enrollment period continues until March 31.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks tumbled on Monday, pushing the Dow Jones industrial average down more than 320 points after reports of sluggish U.S. growth added to investor worries about the global economy. The slump follows the Dow's worst January performance since 2009.
 The market stumbled from the get-go, with U.S. markets opening lower after declines in European and Japanese indexes. Then it quickly turned into a slide as a spate of discouraging economic data on everything from manufacturing to auto sales to construction spending poured in.

ON MONDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 326.05 points, or 2.1 percent, to 15,372.80.
 The Standard & Poor's 500 index dropped 40.70 points, or 2.3 percent, to close at 1,741.89.
 The Nasdaq composite fell 106.92 points, or 2.6 percent, to 3,996.96.
FOR THE YEAR SO FAR:
 The Dow is down 1,203.86 points, or 7.3 percent.
 The S&P 500 is down 106.47 points, or 5.8 percent.
 The Nasdaq is down 179.63 points, or 4.3 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Wheat for March delivery rose 8 cents to \$5.6375 a bushel; March corn was 1.75 cents higher \$4.3575 a bushel; March oats rose 9 cents to \$4.1475 a bushel; while March soybeans advanced 10 cents to

\$12.9275 a bushel.
 Beef and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 April live cattle was 1.02 cents lower at \$1.3940 a pound; March feeder cattle was 1.42 cent lower at \$1.68 a pound; while April lean hogs fell 1.95 cents to \$9.285 a pound.
